I James Jenkins of the county and state aforesaid, being weak in Body and of feeble health; but of sound mind and disposing memory, being desirous to dispose of my worldly Goods by Will, have ordained and Established this my last Will and Testament, hereby Revoking all former Wills; —

First I recommend my soul to God who gave it, my body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors. —

Second. — my Will and desire is that my Executors pay all my last debts. —

Third I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Jenkins all my Estate Real and personal, Counting Lands Negroes, Utensils, hold and Fitcher's furniture, stock of every kind debts and every other species of property I am seized and possessed of, of any kind whatsoever. —

Lastly. — I nominate and appoint my wife Elizabeth Jenkins my Executors, and my friend Thomas Stokes my Executor to this my last Will Testament with full power to carry the same into full Effect. —

Greene County I Littleton D. Caldwell of the County State of Georgia, being of sound mind & memory knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, have thought proper to prepare for that event by making this my last will & testament —

Item 1st

Devise all my last debts paid. —

Item 2nd

I have placed in the hands of E. Wingfield Esq. a note of hand on John D. Brown for one hundred and twenty five dollars sent to me for collection by Curthbert Muse of Florida said note, I now may be given up to my Executors in order that it may be sent back to its owner. —

Item 3rd

Devise my family left together this year for the purpose of finishing the crop a part of which is already commenced —

Item 4th

At the end of the year they (my Executors) may still continue to keep the plantation by continuing the family shares thereon, or by making disposition of the plantation hands to as they may think best for the interests of my family. —

Item 5th

I owed my father ten dollars, which I wish collected I took no note for it. —

Item 6th

There is due me by Lat. & Joseph Grimes eighteen dollars for loan sent them. —

Item 7th

Due me from Albert Loringham thirty five dollars

Item 8th

I hereby appoint my wife Cynthia & Albert Loringham my Executors — In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal April 3rd 1833 signed & sealed in presence of
