House where he now lives & Spring & then up to the public
road so as to include Twenty Five Acres

Item 3rd I will & bequeath to my Wife Mary Kennedy The remainder
of my property during her natural life

Item 4th I will that after the death of my wife that my land
be equally divided between the heirs of Abby Hays Mary
Kennedy, Jonathan Kennady, Nancy Kennedy, Mary Kennedy

Item 5th I will and bequeath to my Daughters Nancy & Mary
Kennedy, all my perishable property over and above their
share in the land

Item 6th I will that My sons Jonathan & Andrew Kennady execute
this my last Will and Testament
