aforesaid being now in a low state of health but of sound mind and
memory (and) Calling to mind that mind that it is appointed for all men once
to die do make this my last will and Testament. The first of all I give my
soul to God who gave it and my body I resign to its another destiny as directed
near burial the expenses to be paid out of my Estate.

Item 1st I give my land that I now live upon, my waggon my bed and furniture
to my Son William Reynolds, my daughter Baby Cross my daughter Nancy
Walden my daughter Polly Moore my daughteroley (Burham) and my daughter
Rebecca (Burham) to be equally divided among them.

Item 2nd I give to my Son John Reynolds ten Dollars to be paid out of my Estate.

Item 3rd I give to my Son James Reynolds a negro woman named Hanna
(and) two children named Mahala a girl and Dick a boy together with a
small Cattle my Stock of Cattle Hogs &c my plantation tools and all the rest
of my property as if particularly mentioned.

Item 4th My will further is that if my Son James that now lives with me shall
have a crop, or have begun a crop on the land that I now live upon at my
death, that he shall have the right of finishing (said) Crop and be entitled to all
the benefits thereof.

Item 5th My will further is that my son James Reynolds shall pay out of the
property that I have given him all my just debts except the ten Dollars above
mentioned to John Reynolds which shall be paid out the property given to my
Children.

Item 6th I Appoint my Son John Reynolds my Son James Reynolds my Executors
this my last will (and) Testament Signed & Acknowledged in the presence of Samuel
Greene William Fitzpatrick and John Bruce this 18th day of May 1822.
