Georgia In the name of God Amere I James Robinson of the State and Greene County aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind and memory but being conscious of the uncertainty of life have thought proper to make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others by me previously made After this it is my will and desire that my Creditors hereafter named shall pay all my just debts out of such funds of mine as they may have in their hands or by the sale of such property as they in the exercise of their best judgment or discretion may think proper to sell so as to promote my objects herein expressed (and) the best interest of those concerned Keeping in view as far as practicable a sacred regard to such specific legacies as may herein after contained Item 1st I do hereby give and bequeath unto my nephew James Robinson his heirs and assigns forever (he being the son of my Brother Ephraimus Robinson) certain Negro woman named Sophia or Sophy with her future increase but in case my said nephew James Robinson should before he arrives to the lawful age of Twenty one years, then and on that date it is my will and desire that said negro woman Sophia or Sophy and her increase shall descend to my Brother Joseph Robinson of Union district South Carolina and his heirs male if said nephew James Robinson should marry and have lawful issue therefrom in which event said negro and her increase shall go to his lawful issue It is further my will and desire that my Creditors shall during the minority of my said nephew James Robinson act as Guardians or Trustees for him in the management of the (and) Sophia or Sophy and her increase for his use and benefit.

Item 2nd I do hereby give and bequeath unto my (said) Brother Joseph Robinson the residue of my property both real (and) personal debts due or demands after the satisfaction of my debts aforesaid and the specific legacies heretofore pointed out.

Item 3rd I do hereby nominate Constitutes and appoint my worthy friends Thomas Green Jr. (and) Daniel Sanford of (said) State and County my Executors to this my last will and Testament, (and) Trustees for carrying the same into effect full effect by even under my hand and seal this Second day of October 1821
