

John I Beater's Will.

In the name of God am I John I Beater of the County of Greene citizen of Georgia being in perfect strength of my memory do make and ordain this to my last will & Testament. First my will is for my Executor to sell all lot & houses in Greene now lying & belonging the Methodist Church and all my other lands that now lies to him or his children for except the tract of land below Greenberry where my hands are now camping and a part of that to wife a half piece of land I lately purchased of John Bellum except twenty four acres that has been land of Adam Young farm tract my will is for my Executor to sell said lot of land in Greenberry and any other land he provides so as publick as he may choose for the purpose of paying my just debts and to help all my household & kitchen furniture my watch excepted and no sale there is a necessity to sell any of my negroes Joseph my Executor to first sell all negro men named Brown about thirty five years of age, then of a necessity to S. W. Party a woman about twenty five years old then if a necessity to sell more, sell blacksmith John, then if necessary to sell more, to sell big Peter and to sell (say) negroes at put back or private sale as my Executor may see cause. My will is for my negroes Harry & Christopher & one blacksmith to be either hired out or retained on the farm as my Executor may think best to the balance of my negroes to remain on said plantation under such overseers as my Executor may employ (say) my negroes not to be hired out except Harry & blacksmith John. My will is that Mrs. Jane Flores to continue in the house where she now lives and to be supported out of my Estate at the discretion of my Executor. My will is that my Sister Eugenia I Valley to keep my daughter Ann J. H. Beater until she is old enough to go to school and then to be educated at the discretion of my Executor (say) also give my daughter Ann J. H. Beater during her lifetime all my jewelry both real & personal my watch excepted but should she die without an heir or heirs of her body then it is said property to return (say) be divided as follows to wit the plantation that my negroes are now settled upon that I get by my wife (say) all the negroes that came by my side (wife & their increase) that may remain divided by me or my Executor to be equally divided between John H. Beater Henry W. Dodd & Aphrae Dodd children of my wife (wife & their heirs or assigns forever). Other will all the rest of my negroes (Moses a boy now about eleven years old) except the stock or other property that may remain (money excepted) to be equally divided between the children of my Sister Eugenia I Valley. My will is further in case of the death of my daughter without an heir of her body for William J. Beater to have a negro boy Moses now about eleven years old. My will is further that should there be any money or bonds for money in the hands of my Executors at the death of my daughter to die without an heir of her body for the money or bonds for money to be equally divided between the heirs of my Sister Eugenia I Valley my half sister Catherine Valley my half brother John Sager half brother William Sager and their heirs and assigns forever. I will my executors to William J. Beater & their heirs; and lastly I constitute & appoint my friends Thomas T. Foster and John H. Dodd as soon as he comes of age Executors of this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all other instruments made for testifying otherwise I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 1st instant day of February 1826.
