Knowing it is appointed once for all men to die I make the following my la
will and Testament, in the first place I resign my soul to god who g
it & my body to be Buried in a decent manner.

In the first place I wish
my just debts to be paid, and the Ballance of my property to be disposed
of in the following manner.

Item 1st It is my Request that all of my perishable property shall be sold, consist
of one servant girl, 5 in my and all my horses cattle and hogs, house hold
and kitchen furniture, and the money due me now and which will
due me hereafter arising from the sales of my property all to be in the
hands of my Executor to be put to interest for the support of my wife
Susan. Bedell, and my child Mary. Bedell, I request also that my Executor
shall act as guardian for my wife and child and support them for
the interest arising from my Estate yearly as long as she lives a widow
and when she shall die the said money shall be paid to my child Mary
I shall give her 100 Dollars & all the balance of my money
go from my Estate to my child Mary. Bedell, which child I shall

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to begin a good Education by my Executor, which Executor I wish
to act as guardian for my child till she shall become of age
or married I wish my Executor to procure some place for my
child to live, and provided that my wife will not be ad-
vised by my Executor and shall go off out of Reach of my Executor. I
wish him to stop the yearly support above named and for my
Executor to take my child and act as guardian for it, and take
care of it and Educate it, it is my Request that my lot of land
I own in cherokee county Georgia, to be sold at publick sale whenever
my Executor shall think advisable and advantageous. & the money
just to interest for the Benefit of my wife & child as before stated
it is my Request that my brother William Bidell shall act as
my Executor and settle up my Estate and then act as guardian
for my child Mary Bidell. Signed & sealed the day and date
