5th May 1844.

I John Chew being of sound mind
& disposing memory the make & ordain this my last Will & Testament
Thus

I give to my son John, and my two daughters Mary
Ana Elizabeth, Nothing

Also All my property both real and personal, I give to my
friend John Moffat and Lowden Willis in trust for
the following uses & purposes. Viz. First,

To pay and my just debts - Second, To apply the
proceeds of my property to the support, Maintenance
& Education of Virginia, Thomas & William my three youngest
Children, until the youngest of said Children arrives at
the age of twenty one year - And then my Will is, That
said Trusts pay to the fourth of said Estate to my daughter
Margaret for her sole and separate use, free from the control
of her present or any future husband, and the balance of
said Estate at that time to be conveyed to my three
youngest Children share and share alike - And I do hereby
authorize said Trusts to see all or any portion of my
Estate, as to them may seem proper - And I do hereby
appoint John Moffat and Lowden Willis Executors of
this my last Will & Testament.
