I John Cole of the County of Greene and State of Georgia being sick and weak of body but of sound mind and memory do hereby constitute Ordain and appoint this present instrument of writing my last will and Testament in manner and form following (to wit) and first of all I wish all my just debts to be paid and after that my will is that my Estate shall be divided among my Children in the following Order that is to say first I give unto my son Duke Cole the tract of land whereon I now live one negro man named Lucy & Child Jacob and all the money that is in and standing debts due to me also my crop of Cotton now on hand I give unto my daughter Pally Ray I give one negro man named Sam and one negro girl named Judy. I give unto my son John Cole one Dollar I give unto my daughter Sally Newsum one Dollar and my daughter Elizabeth. Prefer I give one Dollar and I give unto my four grand sons (to wit) Sham Cole, Robert Cole, Mathias Cole, and William Cole twenty five cents each and after these legacies are paid out my will and desire is that the residue and remainder of my Estate shall be equally divided between my son Duke Cole & my daughter Pally Ray, and now in Order that above instrument of writing may be fully carried into effect I do hereby constitute Ordain and appoint of son Duke and George Tuggle Executors of this my last will and Testament In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8th day of November 1808. NB the words I give intended is two plots of land between the fourteenth & sixteenth and between the nineteenth and twentieth being before apportioned

5th It is my desire that my granddaughter Luisa Blagrove Davis
should have three hundred Dollars as her portion of my Estate to
have and to hold forever 6th It is my desire and will that my
William Wilborn Jack Wilborn & Thomas Wilborn should share
in my Estate with my daughter Polly Storall & Martha
or in all of my Estate both in Virginia and Georgia
7th It is my wish and will that if my daughters (Polly)
Storall & Martha Maddox should not choose to take the above
named negroes at valuation that they are not compelled
8th It is my will that if my daughters (Polly) Storall & Martha
Maddox should not take the above named negroes (Peggy) &
Fanny they are then to be set up at the highest bidder and
sold and the money to be divided as above that is between my
sons and daughters which I here name William Wilborn Jack
