of my son Thomas J. Anderson

I then do hereby nominate & appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth my son Thomas
Anderson my Executor and Executrix. Testimony whereof I hereunto set

George Greene County. The last will and Testament of John Cott late of Greene County deceased who died on the tenth of September 1826
and was interred at his residence in said County declared by word of mouth on the ninth day of September eighteen hundred
and twenty six "It is my wish that my wife Mary Cott should have all my property". These were the words spoken by the said John
Cott in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses therof this ninth day of September eighteen hundred
and twenty six

The foregoing instrument or statement of the Muncipalities Will of John Cott late of said County & ^{is} ~~is~~ ^{now} John Cott
has been acknowledged in open Court by Mary Cott widow of said deceased and a Seal against the protest thereof having
been placed to it by Alvin Wall & others. The aforesaid trust was generally examined and it appearing that the aforesaid trust fully
agreed with it is ordered and commanded by the Court that the Content of said instrument or statement be taken to be contained in the
last will and Testament of said John Cott & that the same be committed to record as such.

Given the deposition of the Court of Ordinary, the Clerk caused an affidavit which was laid at Record June 1827 of the
Greene County, at which time the affiant deposed that he had seen the original will of John Cott a copy whereof is now in the
possession of a friend who is a citizen of the United States
