 & Anderson my Executors my heirs & Assigns In testimony whereof I hereunto set

The Municipal Will of John Holt.

Georgia Greene County. The last will and Testament of John Holt late of Greene County dec'd who died on the tenth of September Eighteen
 hundred & twenty five at his own residence in said County declared by him by word of mouth on the ninth day of September Eighteen hundred &
 twenty five "It is my wish that my wife Mary Holt should have all my free property". These were the words spoken by the said John
 Holt in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our names as Witnesses this ninth day of September Eighteen hundred &
 twenty five
 Georgia (Greene County) Court of Ordinary January Term 1827
 The foregoing Memorandum or Statement of the Municipal Will of John Holt late of said County &c. being
 here exhibited open Court by Mary Holt widow of said dec'd &c. and a caveat against the probate thereof having
 been filed by Samuel L. Holt & others. The undersigned Clerk was severally examined and it appearing that the execution of the last had been fully
 complied with. It is ordered and Considered by the Court that the contents of said Memorandum or Statement be taken and regarded as the
 last will (and Testament) of said John Holt dec'd & that the same be committed to record as such.
 Given the decision of the Court of Ordinary the Executors entered an appeal which was laid at March Term 1827 of the
 Superior Court, at which time the appeal was argued and the Court decided in favor of the said John Holt & his heirs and assigns
 the fee & ownership which was at that time
