Item 3^d I will and bequeath to my brother Alfred F. Anderson my Watch

Item 4th I appoint James H. Garrett my Executor to this my last Will (and Testament) making all previous Will or Wills by me made In Whichever thereof I have hereunto set my hand & date this 2nd December 1823

John Garratts Will

In the name of God Amen. I John Garratt Farmer of the State of Georgia and County of Greene being of sound mind & memory but recollecting the certainty of death do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament. It is my will and desire that any body be buried in a decent & Christian like manner and as it respects such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I desire to dispose of the same in the following manner (First)

First It is my will & desire my just debts and funeral expenses be paid

Item 2^d It is my will and desire (and I do will and bequeath unto my three grand Children of the B Garratt (1823) Martha B Garratt John A Garratt & Anne M Garratt the following negroes namely Sally a woman and Lundy a Girl Neek a boy Belle a fellow (and increase but for the use of Thomas B Garratt my son during his natural life

Item 3^d It is my will & desire and I do hereby give and bequeath to my Executors hereafter to be named three negroes namely Cely a woman Beckie a boy Richard a boy all to be applied to (and for the use of Elizabeth M Dickman her lifetime and after her death to her legal Children if any in for example be it in case of one child or Children legal heirs then it is my will and desire the three negroes (viz) Cely Beckie & Richard with increase to be legally divided among all my Children or their legal representatives who are bed bedstead furniture

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Item 4th I in my will and devise and I do hereby give and bequeath unto my son John H. Barrett Dan person namely Sam a fellow George a boy Isaac a woman & Nancy a child also can bed business & furniture on for simple

Item 5th I in my will and devise and I do hereby give and bequeath to my Executors hereafter named the following negroes namely (say) Abram a fellow Miles a fellow all to be applied to for the use of deacons P. Barrett during his life and after his death to his legal children say on for simple

Item 6th I in my will and devise and I do hereby give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy B. Daniel one negro namely Robert a boy to be equally divided at her death among all her children

Item 7th I in my will and devise and I do hereby give and bequeath unto my son Salem H. Barrett the following the following negroes namely Esther, Charity, both women Ben a boy, Andrew a boy, Malinda a girl, Simon a man, Winny a girl and increase to be his property on for simple at the age of twenty five years also one bed & bedstead furniture

Item 8th I in my will and devise and I do hereby give and bequeath unto my son Humphrey H. Barrett the following negroes namely Benny a girl Old David a man Peter a man Aggy a woman little David a boy Thomas a boy and increase and increase to be his property on for simple at the age of twenty five years also one bed & bedstead furniture

Item 9th I in further my will and devise and I do hereby require that all my household & kitchen furniture stock of all kinds farming utensils waggons & Sec with all other property not otherwise devised is to be sold at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named

Item 10th It is further my will and devise that all my lands be sold at the discretion of my Executors and after all my just debts are paid the overplus of any to be equally divided between all my children and grand children & special.

I the said John Barrett do hereby nominate constitute and appoint John H. Barrett Ezekiel Daniel & Thomas H. Barrett my lawful Executors to execute this my last will & Testament hereby nullifying and revoking all former wills and Testaments legacies and bequests heretofore made ratifying this & confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament Given under my hand and seal 3rd day Jan'y 1828
