 null and void all other wills or wills made by me
 Item 1st It is my will that my body may be decently buried and all my
 just debts faithfully discharged by my executor hereafter named
 Item 2nd I give to my daughter Elizabeth Hill a negro girl named Malinda with her
 future increase
 Item 3rd I give to my daughter Mary Ann Hill a negro girl named Lillian with her future increase
 Item 4th I give to my daughter Ann Hill a negro girl named Betty with her future increase
 Item 5th I give to my daughter Martha Hill three negroes viz from Banks & his
 May together with their future increase
 Item 6th I give to my daughter Sally Hill formerly but now Sally Riley a negro girl
 named Reech & her future increase
 Item 7th I give to my daughter Martha Hill another negro woman by name young to be
 disposed of at the thinks proper
 Item 8th I give to my grand daughters viz Matilda Blanks Martha & Isabella Blanks
 daughters of William Blanks and Jean Blanks his wife who has lately deceased two
 hundred Dollars to be divided between them share & share alike, to be paid over to them
 hereafter out of the sales of land
 Item 9th I give to my daughter Septimia Campbell wife of James R. Campbell five Dollars
 having given and provided for them heretofore; and whereas the aforesaid Septimia Campbell
 wife of James R. Campbell having been unfortunate; I give to my daughter Martha
 Hill a negro woman named Phillis to and for my daughter Martha
 Hill in making a support comfortably for her the aforesaid Septimia Campbell
 Item 10th It is my will that my daughters Elizabeth Mary Ann Martha and Ann have
 each of them three beds & furniture belonging to them also their Bowdler beddies trunk
 trunks or chests which are now known in the family to be theirs or claimed by them
 also a spinning machine to be equally divided between them
 Item 11th It is also my will that my son Joseph Hill have the sum of five hundred Dollars
 to him as a collection on a mortgage of the lands of my land
 Item 12th I give to my 1810-1842 a negro boy named Puffin

Item 13th It is my will that my grand daughter Anna Ashburn daughter of John Ashburn & Pelly Ashburn do have a negro girl of ten or twelve years old out of my Estate as soon as the money can be collected and a purchase made on a fair price, provided the aforesaid Anna Ashburn relinquish all claims to her mother's claims on my Estate.

Item 14th It is also my will that my little grand son William Ashburn have the sum of one hundred Dollars and I will enable him to acquire his Education but should my lineal descendants be without issue my will is that the balance of money be laid out and kept at interest for him.

Item 15th It is my will that all my land which I am possessed of; & lives on be sold to the best advantage on a fair price as soon as convenient and that the sum of three thousand Dollars arising from said sale be appropriated for the use of purchasing again land, and build a comfortable house for my daughters who are now single or unmarried viz; Elizabeth Mary Ann Martha and Ann should any of my daughters aforesaid marry my will is that case that person so marrying remove from said place immediately or as soon as the nature of the case admits.

Item 16th It is my will that the balance of money arising from the sale of my land be put out on lawful interest by my Executors.

Item 17th And as to my stock of all kinds, farming tools, household & kitchen furniture and has not otherwise been disposed of shall still remain for the use of Elizabeth Mary Ann & Ann; but should they disagree in sentiment respecting said property my will is that it be exposed to public sale; and should a disagreement take place respecting the purchase of made out of the three thousand Dollars my will is that said land be sold and the money arising from said sale to be equally divided between my daughters viz; Elizabeth Mary Ann Martha and Ann.

Item 18th Having reference to the 16th Item it is my will that the balance of money arising from the sale of my land be put out on lawful interest by my Executors and of seven years and at the expiration thereof the principal & interest shall be equally divided share & share alike amongst the surviving Legatees.

Item 19th And lastly I do hereby constitute nominate and appoint my trusty friends Robert and Eliza Robins my Executors in this my last will and testament hoping and trusting they may see it duly executed August 11th 1817 Given under my hand & seal in presence of

Executors after deducting the amount of certain notes which I received with my wife
and one note upon Moses Campbell for one hundred and fifty dollars and one other

4th It is my will that the remainder of my property ^{both real & personal} be equally divided among
