Georgia (3)

Greene County, 3 In the name of God my Creator Amen. I John Stepp being sick  
 3<sup>rd</sup> Octo 1825 & weak of body but of a sound and disposing memory do make and ordain  
 this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following.

First My Will and desire is that all my just debts be paid

Item I leave my living wife Martha Stepp my plantation wherein I now live during her natural  
 life, also I leave to my living wife all my household (and) Kitchen furniture all my Stock of every  
 description also all my plantation Tools of every description. And at her death I give and  
 bequeath the aforesaid plantation all furniture Tools Stock &c of every description which she and  
 Martha Stepp may not make use of for the support of herself during her natural life to my son  
 Stephen Stepp to him and his heirs forever. I do also constitute Robert Douth Stephen Stepp my sole &  
 sole Executor of this my last Will (and) Testament (and) I do hereby disallow and revoke any and every  
 former Will or Wills or legacies ever bequeathed by me in any way before whatever  
 this Willings whereof I have hereto set my hand affixed my seal the day and year above written  
 Attest & sealed & delivered in the presence of
