Catoosa County I John West Jr. of  
the town of Catoosabough in said County calling to mind the uncertainty  
of life and the certainty of death, being weak in body, but  
of sound mind & memory, do ordain and constitute this my  
last will and testament in manner and form following:

- 1<sup>st</sup> I give my body to the dust to be entombed at the  
discretion of my Executors herein after named, my soul  
I recommend to god who gave it.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> My will and desire is, that all my just debts be paid  
as soon as my Executors can do so, out of this first and  
they can collect due and from my mercantile debts:
- 3<sup>rd</sup> My will and desire is, that my Executors wind up my  
mercantile business as soon as they can do so, without Injury  
to my estate; and I hereby authorise my said executors  
to make such a sale of my goods as they in their Judgment  
may consider most to the Interest of my estate, by selling  
off my stock of goods either at public or private sale  
my will and desire is that my property in the town of  
Catoosabough, and my curry and woods tracts of land be  
sold on a credit of one, two & three years. my plantation  
Tools, crop, Stock &c to be sold on a credit of one year; my  
carriage & horses and such a portion of my House held pur-  
ture as my wife may wish. I desire should be retained by  
my executors for the use of my wife & children, my negroes  
wife disposed of as follows, I give and bequeath to my  
beloved wife Mary West, one negro man styling, Amilia, and  
Her daughter of Mary Anna James, children of this said Amilia  
All the balance of my negroes and their Increase I give  
my children, to be divided share and share alike between  
them, at the marriage or coming of age of either of them;  
It is further my will and desire that my Executors proceed as  
soon as practicable to close the Business of west and annual, at  
what ever amount may be realized from said concern to be applied  
in aid of the settlement business until all my outstanding  
debt are settled. Then my will and desire is, that one hundred  
and twenty five dollars be paid by my Executors to the  
Executive committee for the benefit of the Labouring school under  
the patronage of the Baptist convention, and that a like sum  
be paid to the Baptist convention for Burman missis-

ns.

11<sup>th</sup> When my Executors collect the money due me and also  
the money due my estate for the sale of property herein  
directed to be sold and pay all the demands against

nd and the two Legacies last mentioned, my will made  
desire is that one third of the amount of money so sum  
be paid over to my wife and the balance to be equally  
divided between my children. It is further my wish and I  
humbly request my executors to divide the money given to  
my children as convenient to their uses as practicable.

I nominate and appoint my wife Mary West my Executive  
and Jeremiah Sanford of Hancock county and Thomas St.  
of Greene County Executors to this my last will and testam-  
ent witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal  
this 23 July 1832

Georgia Court of Ordinary September Term 1832  
Greene County Personally appeared in open court, Lemuel. Greene  
& Lewis. Pyron, two of the subscribing witnesses to the within  
last will. Testimony recd. of John. West Jr. and on oath,  
saith, that they saw him subscribe the same and that they  
each believed him to be of perfect sound mind & disposing  
memory at the time of his signing the same, and that they  
were with Peggy. Bails in the presence of each other and in the  
presence of the testator subscribed their names as witnesses thereto  
Sworn to in open Court by Lemuel. Greene
