

Georgia I am the name I goe by now I Joel Parish of the
 Greene County, County and State aforesaid being in sound mind and
 memory but infirm and of age coming on apace am calling to mind that
 it is appointed for all men to die & do therefore make and
 ordain this my last will and Testament in the manner form as follows hereby
 revoking all other wills & Testaments made by me heretofore.

I therefore desire to recommend my soul to God who giveth help where help
 can be had through the mediation of the Lord Jesus Christ (and) that my
 body may be buried as my beloved family may think proper.

2d desire that the worldly goods it hath pleased God to give me first to pay
 my just debts (and) the remainder to my beloved family.

3d will & bequeath to my beloved wife Rodes Parish her natural lifetime to
 negroes by the names of Virgil and Dinah also all the land lying on the
 west side of the Great road also part of the land lying on the east side of
 the great road commencing at a persimmon taking in the Spring running al-
 ways towards the back line and that the Creek fence shall be moved on the
 line before the division takes place also to have my big and Barney as a
 horse such as one of my ancestors may think proper also two Cow & Calves two
 hores & pigs thirty Barrels Corn for hundred weight of Pork two beds of furniture as I
 may think proper to keep up hold during her natural life (and) after her decease
 property to be sold and equally divided between my beloved Children.

4. I will bequeath to my son Henry Parish one negro boy by the name of Isaac
 also I will & bequeath to my son Nathaniel Parish one negro boy by the name of Ishmael
 also I will & bequeath to my daughter Sally S. Astor wife to Wm S. Astor one negro
 named John. Also I will & bequeath to my daughter Mary J. Parish one negro girl
 Fanny Also I will (and) bequeath to my grand daughter Sally M. Wyne one negro
 Stephen Also I will (and) bequeath to my son in law Hamblin Wyne five shillings
 besides what I have already given him. It is also my desire that the balance of
 property be sold (and) that the above named negroes be valued and that an equal
 distribution take place between my beloved Children to wit Jonathan Parish
 & F. Parish Sally Davis wife to Abner (Davis), Sally S. Astor Wife to William P.
 Henry Parish & Nathaniel Parish (and) also my grand daughter Sally M. Wyne
 have an equal share after deducting one hundred (and) thirty Dollars from her share
 it is also my desire and wish that Hamblin Wyne have nothing to do w/ the property
 I therefore desire & wish that my beloved friend Vincent Sanford may act for Sally
 Wyne & that her father Hamblin Wyne have nothing to do w/ the property
 it is further my wish that before a division of my property takes place that the
 of my dear children to whom I have already given some things to would make known
 how much as I am to deal with them all alike as near as I can. I therefore app-
 point my beloved wife Rodes Parish my executors also my son Henry Parish & my beloved
 friend Vincent Sanford as trustees to act w/ my beloved wife for that my last will &
 Testament Whereunto I have set my hand (and) affixed my seal this 16 day of March

Georgia Greene County I give the name of John Hill of the

memory do hereby constitute this my last will and testament and hereby revoking
all (or now) all other wills or wills made by me at any time before this
time first It is my will that my body may be decently buried and all my
just debts faithfully discharged by my executors hereafter named
Item 1st I give to my daughter Elizabeth Hill a negro girl named Elizabeth future
increase^{to} I give to my daughter Anna Hill a negro girl named Betsy with her future increase
Item 2nd I give to my daughter Martha Hill a negro girl named Martha with her
future increase^{to}
Item 3rd I give to my daughter Mary and Hill a negro girl named Lydia their future
increase^{to} I give to my daughter Anna Hill a negro girl named Betsy with her future increase
Item 4th I give to my daughter Martha Hill another negro woman by name of Lucy to be
disposed of at the death of Lydia
Item 5th I give to my grand daughters big Matilda Blanks Martha & little Matilda Blanks
daughters of William Blanks and Jane Blanks his wife who has lately deceased two
hundred Dollars to be divided between them share & share alike to be paid over to their
executors hereafter named out of the sale of Land
Item 6th I give to my daughter Deborah Campbell wife of James R. Campbell his
slaving queen (and) provider for their household; and whereas the aforesaid Deborah Campbell
wife of James R. Campbell having been unfortunate I give to my daughter Deborah
Martha Hill a negro woman named Phillis to (as) (and) after my daughter Martha
Hill is making a support comfortable for her the aforesaid Deborah Campbell
Item 7th it is my will that my daughters Elizabeth Mary and Martha and any
one of them have beds & furniture belonging to them also their bedding & clothes
also a spinning machine to be equally used between them
Item 8th It is also my will that my son Joseph Hill have the sum of five hundred dollars
to begin as a Greene County Wills sale of my land
Item 9th I give 1816-1842 Hill a negro boy named Dayton
