

Georgia In the name of God Amen I Joel Parrish of the
 Queens County 3 County and State aforesaid being in sound mind and
 memory but infirm and old age coming on upon me calling to mind that
 it is appointed by Almighty God for all men to die I do therefore make and
 Ordain this my last will and Testament in the manner form as follows hereby
 revoking all other wills and Testaments made by me heretofore
 1 I desire to recommend my soul to God who gave it hoping he will
 receive it in mercy through the mediation of the Lord Jesus Christ and that my
 body may be buried as my beloved family may think proper
 2 I desire that the worldly goods it hath pleased God to give me first to pay
 my just debts and the remainder to my beloved family
 3 I will & bequeath to my beloved wife Roder Parrish her natural lifetime to
 negroes by the names of Virgil and Dinah also all the land lying on the
 west side of the Great road also part of the land lying on the east side of
 the great road commencing at a perpendicular taking in the spring running at
 that corner to the back line and that the Craft fence shall be moved on the
 line before the division takes place also to have my pig and Harems and a good
 horse such as one as my Executors may think proper also two cows & calves two
 sows & pigs thirty Barrels Corn six hundred weight of Pork two beds of furniture as I
 may think proper to keep I hold during her natural life (and) after her decease
 property to be sold and equally divided between my beloved children
 4 I will & bequeath to my son Henry Parrish one negro boy by the name of Isaac
 also I will & bequeath to my son Nathaniel Parrish one negro boy by the name of Asha
 also I will & bequeath to my daughter Sally & Astor wife to Wm. S. Asha one negro
 named John also I will & bequeath to my daughter Mary F. Parrish one negro girl
 named John also I will & bequeath to my grand daughter Sally M. Wynne one negro
 Stephen also I will & bequeath to my son Isaac Hamblin Wynne five shillings &
 besides what I have already given him It is also my desire with the balance of
 property be sold and that the above named negroes be valued and that an equal
 distribution take place between my beloved children to wit Jonathan Parrish &
 F. Parrish Mary Davis wife to Abner Davis Sally S. Astor wife to William P.
 Henry Parrish Nathaniel Parrish and also my grand daughter Sally M. Wynne
 have an equal share after deducting one hundred and thirty Dollars from her share
 it is also my desire and wish that Hamblin Wynne have nothing to do with my estate
 I therefore desire & wish that my beloved friends Vincent Sanford may act for Sally
 Wynne & that her father Hamblin Wynne have nothing to do with her part of the property
 it is further my wish that before a division of my property takes place that that
 of my dear children to whom I have already given some things to would make to
 how much as I write with with them all alike as near as I can I therefore appoint
 my beloved wife Roder Parrish my executor also my son Henry Parrish & my beloved
 friend Vincent Sanford as executors to act with my beloved wife and I this my last
 & Testament Whereunto I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 14 day of March
