I, George
Greene County, In the name of God Amen, I Jonas Faucher of
the State and County aforesaid, being weak and sick, as to
bodily health, but of perfect mind and sound memory (thanks
be to God for his mercies & calling to mind the mortality of my body,
and that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make make
and ordain this my last will and testament as follows, to wit,
First.

I hereby leave and bequeath after my demise to the Nephews of
each of my wives (to wit) to the Nephews of my first wife Polly Daniel
Faucher, to the Nephews of my last wife, Mary Baker Faucher, to be
equally shared, enjoyed and divided between them, all my Manu-
script writings now on hand, as well as the Exemplars, corrected by
me, of the following literary works, to wit, my Supplement to all English
and to all English and French Grammars; with the Essay on Etymology
etc attached thereto - also the writers verification (in a new and
harmonious system, by him discovered, of Croasall's version of the
Tables of Prof. Phillips, Father - also sundry Miscellaneous Poems as
above said - also a corrected Exemplar of the laws of Nations.
Translation of the Five Codes Napoleon, and also Lindley Murray
Grammar of the English language corrected and adapted
to the principles developed in said Supplement etc. also
another tract, English and French Grammar, corrected and
adapted as above said - and for the purpose of carrying
this final part or portion of my Will into effect I appoint Nath^l
William L. Daniel of the County of Chatham (on the part & in
behalf of the Daniels) and Samuel Baker of the County of Liberty
on the part & in behalf of the Bakers, to be my Executors of this
my last will and testament, he for as to manage the matters
contained in the above foregoing section for their mutual

Executors to carry into effect this my last will & Testament

this eighteenth day of October 1836.
