Jonathan Staralsons Will

Georgia
Greene County In the name of God Amen.
I Jonathan Staralson of the
county and State aforesaid - being advanced in years and knowing that
death is the common lot of man, but being of sound mind and memory
do make and constitute this my last will and Testament - Ws. -
Item 1st

My will and desire, is that my debts be first paid.
Item 2nd
I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary - the negroes Rob
and Molly and her increase after my my debts, one choice Horse
one buckskin carriage and Harness, two choice beds bedsteads &
furniture, one desk, two choice tables, one choice trunk, one choice
set of chairs and one large round chair, two choice boxes and calms
fifty dollars in cash and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sale
by my Executors to be at her own disposal at her death, I also giving
beloved wife a negro woman Fanny and her increase after my
death, my black block during her life time and at her death to
be equally divided between my children, William, Rachel &
Ruth Staralson and Fanny becoming their share at the
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1816
Item 3rd
I give to my daughter wife of Vincent Haralson demands and her
dorming children by her the property and money heretofore given
to her the said one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my
Executors, the said my and each dorming child afterwards, living
there and there alike.

Item 4th

I give to the dorming heirs of the Body of my daughter Patsy Weaver
one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my
Executors to be held by my son Herndon Haralson as agent and
to be paid over to said heirs as they arrive at lawful age.

Item 5th

I give to my daughter Nancy Haralson a Negro woman Esther
which I sold my said daughter about the date one thousand
Eight hundred and twenty, when she removed to Tennessee
with John Weaver and family, and her increase since said sale,
and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my
Executors to be held by my son Herndon Haralson as agent for the use of my
said daughter Nancy during her life time and if said daughter Nancy
should die, leaving no lawful issue, in that case it is my will that
all the aforesaid property bequeathed to her my said daughter Nancy
be equally divided between my son Herndon Haralson and the heirs
of Vincent Haralson dec^d and the heirs of Patsy Weaver dec^d one
third each, my wish is that my son Herndon agent as above left said
Negro together with the living children she may have as soon after my
decease as practicable according to my daughter Nancy the use or the
interest of the proceeds during her life time, and then one third to
Herndon Haralson one third to the heirs of Vincent Haralson dec^d
and one third to the heirs of Patsy Weaver deceased there and
there alike to be paid by my son Herndon Haralson as they arrive
at lawful age.

Item 6th

I gave to my son Herndon Haralson one Negro man by the name of
Lark together with the property and money heretofore given him and
one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my
Executors.

Item 7th

I give to my son William Haralson the following Negroes (viz) Patsy
Abrams and Mariah together with the increases of said Negroes
and also all the money and property heretofore given him and
one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my
Executors.

Item 8th

I give to my daughter Patsy Weaver the following Negroes (viz)
Lewis, Leahy and Mariah and their increases and one ninth
part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my Executors

Item 9th

I give to my son Lincoln P. Parolson the following negroes (viz) Susan, Mary and Minerva, together with the money and property heretofore given him and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my Executors. It is also my will that my son Lincoln have the use and benefit of the farm and pastures wherein I am living, together with the use of all the Horses and stock necessary to carry on the farm, also the corn fodder and grain for the carrying on the farm as also the plows, gear and farming utensils until the twenty fifth of December eighteen hundred and thirty three. It is furthermore my will, that my son Lincoln have the use of all my negroes not heretofore or hereinafter disposed of except the negroes left my wife (viz) Bob, Molly and Fanny, and my wish is that they remain on the farm with my son Lincoln until the twenty fifth of December Eighteen hundred & thirty three - And that he divide the crop with my wife giving her for the same hands a proportionable part or as they may agree -

Item 10th

I give to my son Hugh Parolson the negroes Frank, Lucinda and Nelson and the money and property heretofore given him, together with one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales by my Executors. -

Item 11th

My will is that the Lands wherein I live and all the negroes, I may be possessed of, my stock of all kinds House hold furnitures not herein before disposed of, be by my executors sold so soon after the twenty fifth of December Eighteen hundred and thirty three, as practicable and be equally divided between my wife, my seven children or their heirs and Dey Parolson wife of Vincent Parolson dec^d and her surviving children by said dec^d, giving said Dey and his surviving children one ninth part, my wife and my seven children one ninth part each share and share alike; my will is that my executors dispose of all my Estate both Real and personal, not heretofore disposed of, and divided equally between my wife, my seven children or their heirs (except two ninths of the proceeds of said sales by my Executors giving to Mary Parolson and her heirs and the heirs of Peter Weaver dec^d by John Weaver is to be placed as before devised in the possession of Haridon Parolson agent as aforesaid, and to be divided by him as herein before devised), and Dey Parolson wife of Vincent Parolson dec^d and her surviving children by said dec^d, giving said Dey and her surviving children each an equal part share and share alike, of one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales by my executors and my wife and seven children each one ninth part as aforesaid. -

Item 12th

I do hereby Greene County Will, appoint and constitute my son Lincoln P. Parolson and Thomas J. Jones my Executors to carry this my last Will and Testament into Execution - according to the terms thereof.

David Verrells Will

In the name of God Amen.

I David Verrell of the County of
Greene and State of Georgia, being of sound mind and memory
do make, ordain and Establish this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following.

First

It is my Will and desire that my Executors hereafter named,
shall pay off and discharge, all my Just debts, as soon as they can,
and for that purpose it is my will and desire that my Executors
have power and they or a Majority who may greatly advantage
improved and authorized to sell and convey any part of my
Estate whether Real or Personal that they may think proper
in order to discharge the debts due by me and to Answer
and execute the Devises and bequests herein named and
for the support and maintenance of my family if it should
be necessary.

Secondly

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It is my Will and desire that the whole of my Estate

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
