State of Georgia I James Gathlin of the State and County aforesaid Knowing that I soon (and) shortly (and) am appointed unto all men once to die (and) believing it to be my duty to prepare for this great event by making my peace with God (and) arranging my disposing of my worldly property being weak in body but sound in mind and to provide as far as possible any disagreeable consequences from arising in the settlement of my estate after my decease In the name of God I make this my last will and testament in the manner and form following

1st I command my soul to God who gave it (and) my body to be decently buried in the ground It is my will that after my decease any Executors pay off all my just debts and expenses It is my will that all the property I left with my beloved wife shall remain to her (to wit) three negroes Spirit, Sull (and) her two Children Maria & Luster with all their Cattle (and) a sufficient number of Hogs with all their hogs with her (and) one extra all the horses I got with her (and) one extra to me also (and) with that she (should) have a sufficiency of Corn (and) fedder for the best out of the present growing Crop when it is (and) sowed It is also my will that my wife and her completed (and) made ready for spending together with the plantation wherein stands the house to my wife the Cost (and) expence of rebuilding said mill to be paid by Executors after deducting the amount of certain notes which I received with my wife (and) one note upon Moses Lambille for one hundred (and) fifty dollars (and) one other to upon Andew Swans for seventeen (Dollars) from the net Cost of said Rebuilding

2nd It is my will that the remainder of my property be equally divided among of beloved Children viz Rutherford, Richard, Garrett, Sidney, Nancy and Betsy Gathlin in Proportions I do not wish any negroes sold if a fair division can be made without

3rd It is my wish that my property should be kept together as long as my Executors will it would be advantageous & profitable for my dear Children

4th I hereby Appoint (and) chuse Richard Asbury (and) my Son (and) his Executors this my last will (and) testament for testimony that the above is my last will and testament I hereunto subscribe my name and affix my seal this twenty fifth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & Eighteen
