Greer I give I bequeath one girl named Mary to my ^{next} eldest grand daughter Cordelia I give one negro girl named Phannar to my grand daughter Sophia Caroline Greer I give I bequeath one negro girl named Abby to my grand daughter Eugenia C. Greer one negro girl name Charlotte. Lastly, I appoint my beloved wife Letitia L. Greer executrix & my two sons Thomas & John executors of this my last will & testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 26th July child Julia daughter of Kitty not mentioned above I give to my son John.

Joshua Bunkley's Will

In the name of God amen I Joshua Bunkley of the County Greene & State of Georgia being weak in body but of sound mind & memory knowing it is appointed unto man to die do ordain this as my last will & testament first of all I give my soul to God who gave it my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion of my friends touching such worldly goods as it pleased God to be blest me with I bequeath in the following manner I will all my lawful debts first to be paid & all my property to be together on the plantation whereon I now live that my beloved wife Elizabeth Bunkley draw for herself indifferently one third of the net arising from my plantation & farm after all the families support & expenses is paid & the residue to be divided equally among my children or widow & orphans but in the event of my wife's death my property is to be equally divided

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between my beloved wife Elizabeth & my four children viz Susan
Bunkley, Thomas Bunkley, Mary Elizabeth Bunkley & Martha Ann
Bunkley & I further appoint my friends John Bunkley & Albert B
Bunkley my lawful executors of this my last will & testament
I will further that if my negro man Bob become refractory and
disobedient that my executors shall have full power & authority
to sell him & appropriate the money to the payment of my debts where
I have set my hand & affixed my seal this 2nd of October 1825

In the Name of God Amen, I Samuel Alexander of
the County of Surry State considering the precariousness of life
& the certainty of death & being now in perfect health & in the
full enjoyment of my intellectual faculties do make this my
last will & testament in manner & form following Viz

In the first place I commend my soul into the hands of
Almighty God who gave it & my body to the care of my surviving
friends as to my worldly goods I dispose of them in manner following
Item 1st I wish it distinctly understood that my wife Alexander Susan
Alexander is to hold in her own right all the property that was
willed her by her former husband (John Bush) & that at
my death she is not to receive any part of my estate except that
willed her in the foregoing part of this Item

Item 2nd I wish it also distinctly understood that I have already given
& cleaned unto my four children to wit late Mary Simmons
now Mary Grimes Annelle Roberts James Wooten Alexander and
Asa Washlowe Alexander all the property which I desired they should
ever receive from my estate

Item 3rd I leave unto my daughter Mary Grimes during her natural
life a negro Woman named Darcus & her increase & at her death
I desire that the said negro Woman & her increase as aforesaid to be
equally divided amongst my said daughter Marys children by both
her former & present husbands or in other words to be equally divided
