Lewis Jenkins's Will

Georgia: In the name of God Amen. I Lewis Jenkins of the County of Green County: State aforesaid being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory have made and retained this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all former wills to wit

First My will I desire is that after my decease my Executors hereinafter named pay all my just debts.

Item 2nd I give unto my beloved wife Polly Jenkins all and singular my Estate real & personal during her natural life, and at her death the whole of my Estate real & personal to be divided into three equal parts; One part of which my will I desire is shall be vested in my brother Elijah Jenkins and his heirs as a fee simple property forever and one other part or third my will I desire is shall be equally divided among the children of my deceased brother Silas Jenkins (excepting Mrs. William Allen the eldest daughter of my brother aforesaid to whom I give nothing) to be divided share & share alike among them and their heirs forever. The remaining part or third my will and desire is shall be equally divided between Mr. Shelly Jenkins and his heirs as a fee simple property forever share and share alike between here and his children. Lastly I do hereby appoint my wife Polly Jenkins my Executors to this my last Will & my friend Pelseron P. King & Sterling Fresham Jenkins my Executors to this my last Will with full power to carry the same into effect agreeable to the true intent and meaning thereof.

Thomas Fambroughs Will

I signed In the name of God Amen. I Thomas Fambrough of Great County & Gent. being of sound & disposing mind & memory do make & Ordain this to be my last will & Testament revoking all others in manner following to wit:

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Anderson Fambrough five Dollars and all my wearing apparel above what I have heretofore given him

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Bart a negro girl named Mary over and above what I have heretofore given her

Item I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Sally Bart a negro girl named Abby

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved son Thomas Fambrough a negro woman named Hannah and her two children Nancy & Emanuel over and above what I have heretofore given him.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Fambrough one dollar in addition to what I have heretofore given him.

Item I give and bequeath to my grand son Thomas Fambrough son of ^{William} David a negro boy named David

Item I give and bequeath to the lawful heirs of my son William to be equally divided among them two negro men Joe & Jack

Item I give to my beloved and affectionate wife Mary Fambrough a negro man named Jesse and his wife Daphne and all the household & Kitchen furniture & stock of plantation &c. to be kept by her during her widow hood or until my two youngest daughters Abigail & Eliza or either of them marry or become of age but if she marry or either of ^{my} children marry then it is to be equally divided between the three except the two negroes above named which shall remain the property of the above named Mary. It is further more my will and desire that my ^{will} named wife Mary keep possession of the said intensions I now live & the negroes
