Exposed Security } In the name of God Amen, I Jachens Wright of the State and County aforesaid being sick and weak in body but perfect in mind and memory, thanks be to Almighty God for the same, but knowing the mortality of man, after recommending my soul to God who gave it and my body to the dust to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors &c. Touching my property and effects which with the Almighty I do so please to bless me with, (after my debts are all paid) disposed of in the manner following. (Viz)

1st I desire & ordain that my beloved wife Annath Wright should abide & continue on the place we now live on, keep the family together & have the entire control of all my estate both real and personal with this intent, that our children may be raised and I charged out of the proceeds of the farm, having some other person with her hereafter named to assist her in the prosecution of so arduous an enterprise. It is to be the most judicious way of effecting the purpose.
