I, Martha Maddox being of sound mind, of the State of Georgia
Greene County make this my last will and Testament in the manner and
form following: 1st It is my desire after my just debts are paid, that my
son Robert Gilliam should have two Dollars for his legacy of my
Estate forever. 2^d It is my desire that my daughter Nancy Maddox
Nancy Willborn should have two Dollars as her portion of my Estate to have
and to hold for ever. 3^d It is my desire that my daughter Polly
Storall late (Polly) Willborn should, a negro woman Fanny and her
increase at valuation to be valued by three honest disinterested free-
holders my meaning is not for her to have the said negro and increase
contingent but to share equal with those I shall name here after.
4th It is my desire that my daughter Martha Maddox late Martha
Willborn should have a negro woman Peggy and her increase at
valuation to be valued by three honest disinterested freeholders my mean-
ing is not for her to have the said negro and increase contingent but to
share equal with those I shall name here after.
5th It is my desire that my granddaughter Luisa Blagrove Davis
should have three hundred Dollars as her portion of my Estate to
have and to hold forever. 6th It is my desire and will that my son
William Willborn Jacob Willborn & Thomas Willborn should share
in my Estate with my daughter Polly Storall & Martha Maddox
or in all of my Estate both in Virginia and Georgia.
7th It is my wish and will that if my daughters Polly
Storall & Martha Maddox should not choose to take the above
named negroes at valuation that they are not compelled
8th It is my will that if my daughters Polly Storall & Martha
Maddox should not take the above named negroes (Peggy &
Fanny) they are then to be set up at the highest bidder and
sold and the money to be divided as above that is between my son
and daughters which I here name William Willborn Jacob
Willborn Thomas Willborn Polly Storall & Martha Maddox.

And Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons Jack
William & Thomas William my sole Executors to this my last will
and testament, over all my Estate both in the States of Georgia
& Virginia. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this eleventh day of September One thousand Eight hundred
and twenty
