I Elizabeth Torrance bar of the County of Green State of Georgia being sick and weak of body but of sound mind & disposing memory Do make my last will & testament in manner and form following to wit I Give unto my son Thomas for now living in Virginia to him his heirs the sum of four Dollars being one fourth of all my property now in my hands

I Give unto John son of Thomas now in Virginia named Dublin to him and his heirs forever one share of the American Newspaper & daughter of the said Thomas named Daniel and the sum of thirty Dollars to his heirs forever

as I Give unto my daughter Sarah Perkins two Negroes named Billy & Betty & Betty's increase during her natural life and as I Give unto my daughter Sarah Perkins including two children of the said Sarah Perkins & later on James & later on the life of James Johnston & later on his heirs

I Give unto my daughter Nancy Thomas during her natural life one Negro woman named Mary the child of Mary but at her decease the said Mary & her heirs & assigns to return back to her heirs & assigns as their legal representatives including of my son Thomas his heirs

as I Give to my daughter Letitia Maddox one Negro woman named her (and) her increase during her natural life and as I Give to the said Mary and her heirs & assigns to be equally divided the children of the said Letitia Maddox also the said Dollars I Give to said Letitia Maddox to be divided among her children at her decease

as I Give unto my Grand Son Richard A. Kingston son of Daniel & Letitia & one Negro boy named Sam to him and his heirs forever as I Give unto my daughter Elizabeth son one Negro woman named Mary and her child Stephen & also one half of all the property I have & after paying off the legacies pointed out in this my last will & testament I Give unto my daughter Nancy Thomas during her natural life
