 Greene (and) State of Georgia being extremely sick but of perfect sound mind  
 and memory knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die do make it  
 knowne this my last will and testament in manner followinge in writing.

First the first place I wish all my just debts to be paid. Secondly I give & bequeath  
 unto my three sons John Coleman Robert Coleman & Mathew Coleman all my  
 real estate to be equally divided among them consisting of three tracts or parcels  
 of land the tract whereon I now live Containing six hundred and fifty acres one other  
 tract on Little River containing one hundred and twelve and one half acres and one  
 tract in Williamson containing two hundred two and a half acres amounting in  
 all to nine hundred and seventy one acres which said land is to be divided agreeable  
 to quantity and quality between my three sons John Robert & Mathew but is my  
 wish and desire that my beloved wife Elizabeth Coleman shall live on the planta-  
 tion whereon I now live (and) at her death or in case she should marry it is my  
 wish (and) desire that the tract on which I now live be divided equally between  
 John Coleman Robert Coleman and Mathew Coleman I give and bequeath unto  
 my beloved wife Elizabeth Coleman the following negroes to wit Dick Salter and  
 unto Sally & Diley during her widowhood and in case of her marriage to be  
 among my children John Coleman Robert Coleman & Mathew Coleman  
 Coleman & Nancy Williamson share & share alike

and bequeath unto my daughter Amelia Coleman the following negroes to  
 wit Melinda Clarissa (and) Phillis (and) their increase forever  
 and bequeath unto my son John Coleman my negro man Boson  
 and bequeath unto my son Robert Coleman my negro boy Stephen  
 and bequeath unto my son Mathew Coleman my negro boy Henry  
 and bequeath unto my daughter Charlotte Williamson any negro boy Hargrove  
 or my negro girl (Dicy) but is my wish (and) desire that they remain with my wife  
 my beloved wife until they are fifteen years old

and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Coleman my fourwheeled  
 carriage all my horses my stock of every kind plantation tools household  
 furniture Beds bedsteads Tables Chairs sideboards & clocks

in my wish and desire that my Crop of Cotton of last year be sold and my  
 thereafter named pay out of it my son Robert the sum of five hundred  
 to make his part equal to the rest (and) the balance of any go in discharge  
 of just debts & schooling my son Mathew Coleman

and any friends John Daughton & Robert Weston Executors of this my last  
 will & Testament hereby revoking all former wills

I Thomas Bradford Senior of the County of Greene and State of Georgia do hereby  
make publick and declare this to be my last will and testament revoking all other  
manners former (following) to wit.

I give & bequeath to my son John one Dollar in addition to property heretofore given  
I give & bequeath to my daughter Polly one Dollar in addition to what I have given her by due of gift  
I give & bequeath to my son William one Dollar in addition to property heretofore given him by due of gift  
I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth one dollar in addition to what property I have heretofore given her  
I give to my son Thomas one Dollar in addition to property heretofore given him out of my Estate

I give & bequeath to my daughter Sally one dollar in addition to property heretofore given her  
I give & bequeath to my daughter Polly one dollar in addition to property heretofore given her by due of gift  
I give & bequeath to the children of my daughter Elizabeth one (1) dollar

I give & bequeath to my son David the residue of my land besides what I have sold to George  
and son Thomas in addition to what property heretofore given him by due of gift

I give & bequeath to my daughter Polly one Dollar in addition to property given by due of gift  
Lastly it is further my will (and) desire that all my Estate which I have not already given  
myself divided into two parts one mostly to my son William one to my daughter Polly  
one to my daughter Sally one to my daughter Polly and one mostly to my daughter Elizabeth  
& one mostly to be equally divided among the surviving children of my daughter Elizabeth  
that she had by Joseph Doughton. (and) Lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint my son  
William H. Davis Composed Executors of this my last will & testament revoking all  
all former Wills & testaments heretofore made & allying & Confirming this (and) this only as  
last will & Testament given under my hand this 30<sup>th</sup> March 1819
