I give and bequeath to my Grandson Absalom Reddell one feather bed two pillows & bolster five sheets four Counterpane one of which is knotted one blanket one blue checked the other Copras checked also two bed quilts and one large Rose blanket and fifty Dollars in money and also I give unto my Grand Daughter Chaney Reddell fifty Dollars in money and also I give unto my Granddaughters Chaney Smith two sons David and William unto David I give one black cow and earlin and fifty Dollars in money and unto William I give one brown cow heifer and fifty Dollars in money and also I give them two setting chairs a piece and between them one trunk and table one iron pot rack & waffle iron and also I give unto my Great Grand-son James Meriwether son Peyton one feathered two pillows & bolster five sheets & four Counterpane two bed quilts & one large rose blanket six setting chairs one trunk & one table two pots and two ovens one flesh fork one grid iron one frying pan one iron pot rack one set flat iron one iron ladle two pole axes one skillet one side board and all the furniture belonging to it and all the Earthen ware belonging to the cupboard one clock one tin trunk one looking glass one stone curkins and bedstead that belongs with curtain and one hundred dollars in money & one wedding box and unto my Grand daughter Polly Reddell one young black cow and her two earlings and fifty dollars in money Witness my hand and date above written whereunto I set my hand and seal Signed in the presence of
