Georgia In the name of God, Amen.

memory and desirous of disposing of my Estate, do make  
and declare this my last will and Testament.  
I direct that my Estate shall be equally divided between  
my four first Children, A. H. Simonson, Margaret  
Safford, Sarah Howell, & Rachel Simonson, except  
the sum I bought of Mc Gibson, which I give and  
bequeath unto my son Charles Vincent.  
I direct that I shall have Charlotte appointed,  
and take her at the appraisement.

I wish to take Charles with the balance of his <sup>last</sup> property, John & Mary Ann Betty, supported and educated him until he is twenty years of age.  
I think that if Charles & I should die before he is of age that the property should return to my other four children.  
I think that Charles & I should have the property between them.

I think that my stock of horses cattle, & sheep & hogs, also land and stone and also my cotton should be sold to pay my debts that all my house hold furniture should be equally divided between my children.

I also nominate constitute and appoint Albert A. Simonson my Executor hereof thereby giving him full power & authority to manage my Estate as herein before mentioned. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this the 11 day of January 1840.
