I Nancy Wallis being of sound mind and memory but at present in a low state of health do make this my last Will (my) Testament in the manner following vizt I Will any debt or debts that I may be owing at my decease to be paid by my son in law John Heard he having the sum of twenty four dollars from my money from me

2^d I give (and) bequeath to my daughter Polly Trindley twenty acres of land (adjoining) Charles Walls deceased being a part of the tract on which I now live on to be laid out with his line but to take no part of my improvement provided she pays half the expense of laying of said land also to her the said Polly Trindley one Counterpane

3^d I give (and) bequeath to my daughter Nancy Heard twenty acres of land (adjoining) John Heards land to be laid out with his line but to take no part of my improvements provided she pays half the expense of laying of said land also to her the said Nancy one Pillow (and) White Counterpane

4th I give (and) bequeath to my daughter Nancy King the balance of all my land including the houses (and) plantations whereon I now live also one bay mare (and) all my Cattle, and Hogs together with all my household (and) Kitchen Furniture

5th My will is that John Heard pay the sum of ten dollars to my daughter Elizabeth King to be hereby constituted (and) appoint my Brother Andrew McCombs my sole Executor to this my last Will (and) Testament In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand (and) seal this 12th day of March 1810
