

Oliver Porter's Will

State of Georgia
Greene County I, in the Name of God Amen

I Oliver Porter of the County &
State aforesaid being far advanced in years, and calling to mind the
uncertainty of life and certainty of death, do make and ordain this
my last Will and Testament, being sound in mind and of disposing
dispossession.

Fiftieth

I give my body to the dust to be interred at the discretion of my Executors
and recommend my soul to God who gave it.

Secondly

I will that all my just debts be paid.

Thirdly

I will and bequeath to my son William Porter all my Real
Estate lying in the aforesaid County with the appurtenances
thereunto belonging, also a Negro man named Frank abouts
16 Years old, one feather bed bedstead & furniture and four
cows and calves of the first choice over & above an equal distributive
share of my estate.

Fourthly

The balance of my estate consisting negroes stock of all kinds
to devish sold to the highest bidder at publick sale on the
plantation and the proceeds to be equally divided amongst
my surviving children and the offspring of my deceased
deceased children as follows, To the children of my daughter
Tolly Farris one equal share, to the children of my son

Douglas M. Porter one equal share, to the children of my

daughter Mang and King one equal share, to my son

Anthony Porter one equal share, to my daughter Ann

Bafford one equal share, to my son John M. Porter

one equal share, to my son William Porter one equal

share, to my son James M. Porter one equal share,

Leaving Executors or (To John M. Porter, as Trustee for my

Daughter Catharine Farris, and her children, I give

one equal share, Reserving such a portion as they may

think proper for the use and benefit of my said Daughter

Catharine Farris during her natural life and then to be

equally divided among her children, share & share a

like, and I hereby authorize the Trustees or Trustees aforesaid

to purchase to the amount of my said Daughter Catharine

Farris distributive share of the negroes or other things as

they may think best and hold the same in trust as aforesaid.

Fiftieth

I will that my executors so soon as the same can be done
after my death, to pay into the hands of the Treasurer of

Georgia Baptist Convention, the sum of one thousand dollars
to be by him vested in good bank or Railroad stock, or
located at interest in the name of the Georgia Baptist Convention
as a permanent fund so that the interests arising therefrom
may be applied to the furtherance of the Gospel, through missionary
labor as the same may then best be deemed.

I appoint my four sons Anthony Foster, John W. Foster,
William Foster and James H. Foster with my trusty friend
Thomas Steele, my executors to this my last Will and
Testament.

I Oliver Foster do hereby make the following alterations in my said
Will viz, instead of the intervale of my House Hold & Kitchen
furniture, stock of Horses, Hogs, cattle &c &c, I do hereby give to my
son William two more feather beds appendages, besides the one
alluded to in the body of the Will, and to my son Wm a dozen, I give
the balance of the beds and their appendages, and to William
likewise give all my House hold & Kitchen furniture of every
kind, except as above mentioned, and also such portion of the
Hogs, Sheep, Cattle, Horses, Mules & plantations tools as my Executor
may think sufficient reasonable for him in carrying on his farm
living as I calculate he will do on the plantation after my death.
The balance of the stock of all kinds to be sold.

I also desire that in a
division of the negro property William may be allowed to have a
negro Girl or Woman named Penny as his share or let at a
rate or value not exceeding Four hundred Dollars or that an
amounting to a plow, over to my said Executors the sum of
Four hundred dollars he may have her at that price independent
of any division or share.

handsomely.

I give and bequeath to my beloved Father Matthew Walker my
Negroes mainly Mariah, Joe, and Charity.
Thirdly.

I give and bequeath to my Brother Samuel my Horse, Saddle
Bridle and Watch.

Fourthly.

I give and bequeath to my Sister Martha W. Walker one
thousand dollars to be paid to her by my Executor to soon
