### Bermelia Bookles Will

(State of Georgia; I Bermelia Bookles of the County State & County aforesaid being very sick and weak in body  
& sense (and) but of perfect mind & memory calling unto mind the mortality of the body (and) knowing that it is  
apparent for all men once to die do make (and) ordain this my last will & testament as follows

I leave \$100.00 (one hundred dollars) (and) only daughter Mary Ann Bookles one bed, she addt furniture &

all other my (her) clothing which is not in Common use, one Maple Chest, one pine side board one looking glass  
one half Dozen Earthen plates one Cotton wheel & Card. Two Penns (and) three yearlings one note of hand on John J. Brooks  
of forty Dollars (and) one account of five Dollars one note of hand on Thomas Brooks of twenty Dollars balance due  
one note of (now) on William D. Sartley (and) all my distributive share on the dower of my Mother Elizabeth Bookles  
at her death.

I leave (and) do hereby nominate (and) appoint my friend Willis Torrence my executor to this my last will & testament  
& I do hereby comply (and) fully empower him to take charge & dispose of the property before mentioned in this  
Instrument in whatever way he may think proper or best for the interest of my daughter Mary Ann Bookles.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand (and) seal this 11<sup>th</sup> day of October A.D. One thousand and eight  
hundred and twenty eight.
