

In the name of God amen I Peter Baugh of Greene County State of Georgia being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory bless be Almighty God for the same do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner & form as follows (that is to say)

First I Confirm unto my three eldest sons Robert Baugh John A Baugh (and) Richard Baugh the property I have heretofore given them for their Legacy I do further bequest the land on which I now live to be sold (and) the negroes appraised. I further give and bequest unto my beloved wife Mary Ann Baugh one third part of my Estate during her life. I further bequeath an Equal division among my nine youngest Children of wit. Praisella Peter Abraham Daniel Archer Pleasant (Pato) Lucy (and) Charlotte of all the balance of my Estate except unto Praisella Baugh I bequeath one third and furthermore to have Eighty Dollars deducted from Peter Baugh and Abraham Baugh each for the horses I gave them. I also request Praisella to have a negro boy named George Lucy to have Olander (and) Charlotte Polly at their appraisement as they are then valued negroes. I also appoint Peter Baugh Abraham Baugh (and) Daniel Baugh as Executors to settle my Estate to

Before sealing I bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Baugh all her silver spoons. My present crop my debts to be paid out and the balance my beloved wife Mary A Baugh to have one third, and Praisella Lucy Pleasant (Pato) & Charlotte to have the rest.
