

In the name of God amen I Peter Daugh of Greene County State of Georgia being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory bless the Almighty God for the same do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner & form as follows (that is to say)

I do confirm unto my three eldest sons Robert Daugh John A Daugh (and) Richard the property I have heretofore given them for their legacy I do further bequest the land on which I now live to be sold (and) the negroes appraised. I further give and bequest unto my beloved wife Mary Ann Daugh one third part of my Estate during her life. I further bequeath an Equal division among my nine youngest Children of which are Priscilla Peter Abraham Daniel Pleasant Patsy Lucy (and) Charlotte of all the balance of my Estate except unto Priscilla Daugh I bequeath one third and furthermore to have Eighty Dollars deducted from Peter Daugh and Abraham Daugh each for the horses I gave them. I also request Priscilla to have a negro boy named George Lucy to have Elender (and) Charlotte Polly at their appraisment as they are then worth negroes. I also appoint Peter Daugh Abraham Daugh (and) Daniel Daugh as Executors to settle my Estate to

signed sealed & acknowledged by the above named Peter Daugh to be his last will and testament this 25th of May 1817 & at his request in presence of

Before sealing I bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Ann Daugh all her silver spoons. My present crop my debts to be paid out and the balance my beloved wife Mary A Daugh to have one third, and Priscilla Lucy Pleasant Patsy & Charlotte to have the rest.
