In the presence of God amen I Philip
Blasingame of the County of Greene & State
of Georgia being weak in body but of sound mind & memory
do make publish this my last will & testament in manner & form
following That is to say after all my just debts are paid out
of my State my will & desire is that my beloved wife Francis
Blasingame shall have one brace of horses one horse saddle &
bridle one grey horse one blanket the yoke of the wheel in
the harnessing her natural life; whences I now recede
Also it is my will I desire that my daughter Elizabeth Bradshaw
shall have one negro boy name Polly & the heir of Benjamin
Blasingame shall have five dollars in cloth & the heir of
Rachel Ward to have five dollars & also my daughter Sarah Bole
to have five dollars & also my daughter Polly Huxtry to have one
negro girl by the name of Hannah also my son James Blasingame
to have one negro woman by the name of Rachel & two or three
children one a boy by the name of Jacob one a girl by the name of
Charity & all my interest in the contemplated land letters viz two
drams for which I gave in as a revolutionary soldier also
my daughter Nancy Huxtry to have a negro girl in the name
of Chancy It is also my will I desire that if there is any surplus
money after discharging my just debts that it shall be equally divided
between my daughter Elizabeth Bradshaw & son James Blasingame
& daughter Polly Huxtry & Nancy Huxtry & also after the death of
my wife Francis Blasingame the land & all the remaining property
shall be sold & the proceeds equally divided between my daughters
Elizabeth Bradshaw Nancy Huxtry Polly Huxtry & my son
James Blasingame & it is also my will I desire that my son James
Blasingame shall have & take care of my old Negro woman Sally
during her lifetime I do hereby appoint my son James Blasingame
& Abraham Huxtry my whole & sole executor of this my last will &
testament hereby revoking all former will by me made In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 10th day
of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty five

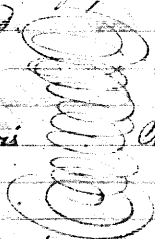
I Josiah Kimbrough of the County of Green State of Georgia
 being sick & weak in body but of sound mind & memory thanks to
 Almighty God for the same but calling to mind the uncertainty of
 this transitory life do make & declare this to be my last will & testament in
 manner & form following

That it is my will & desire that all my just ^{should} be paid out of my estate
 Then I give unto my loving wife Elizabeth Kimbrough one negro woman
 named Jane & one negro girl named Ann & one girl named Nancy one
 girl named Rose & their poster increase I give the said negroes to
 my loving wife Elizabeth to dispose of them as she may think proper
 Then I give unto my loving wife Elizabeth Kimbrough one negro man
 named Bob & all the balance of my estate both real & personal during her
 natural life & at her decease I give the said property to be equally divided
 between the heirs of my brother Braden Kimbrough & my brother John
 Kimbrough I do hereby appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Kimbrough
 & my brother John Kimbrough & John H. Wright executors &
 administrators of this my last will & testament attested & subscribed
 with my own ^{testator} hand by me the witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand this 14th day of October in the year of our Lord 1825
