In the name of God Amen

I Randal Chapman of the County and State aforesaid being of perfect sound mind, but weak in body, and knowing that it is appointed, for all men to die, do make this my last will and testament revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1<sup>st</sup>

I give and bequeath unto my wife Nancy my Plantation whereon I now live together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging for and during her natural life time or during her widowhood.

I also give and bequeath to my wife Nancy two Horses her choice of the Stock all my Stock of Cattle cars and oxen necessary Stock hogs and provisions for her Family for one year - necessary House hold and Kitchen furniture and farming tools to do her the pleasure with.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup>

I give and bequeath to my son William Marion one Roan Colt as his own right and property.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup>

All my other property not named herein to be sold and after paying all my just debts the balance to be equally divided among all my children.

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Lewis Porter my Executor to this my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this seventh day of October 1836
