Chapter 3 In the name of God - Amen

this my last will and Testament in manner and
form following - (that is to say -)

1st I desire and wish all my just debts paid

2nd I give the sum of One Dollar
to my daughter Mary Parker

3rd I give the sum of One Dollar
to my son William L. Austin

4th I give the sum of the entire balance of my Estate both
real and personal to be equally divided between my beloved
wife Nancy Austin, my beloved daughter Rebecca Austin

Aug 5th Monday

I appeared my beloved wife Nancy Astin and her son Hyatt
Margarite Executors of the my last will and Testament.
