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In the name of God Amen I Robert Green being weak in body but of sound
mind and memory do constitute this to be my last will and Testament.
In the first place I commend my soul to God who gave it and my body to be
buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter mentioned
I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Anna Green all and singular
my goods and chattels lands and Tenements during her life or widowhood
Conditioned as follows viz to receive and school my Children and if any of them
should marry during her life or widowhood they are then to draw an Equal
share of my Estate both real and personal and so on until the youngest
comes of age but if should be found that she is wasting any part of said
Estate it is to be taken out of her hands except a Horse and Saddle the Furniture
of Cow and Calf which I allow her if she should marry and also allow
her an Equal division with my Children and my loss properly that she
is spared I wish to be paid to pay my debts and if I should be fortunate enough
to draw any land in the present land lottery I wish it to be sold and the
money to be put out on interest and it is to be understood that after my wife
gets a horse and saddle for and furniture & Cow and Calf an equal division
is to be made among the whole of my Children and I do hereby appoint my
beloved Wife Anna and James Weagy my lawful Executors for all things whereof
I have set my hand and seal this 25th day of September 1820
