Samuel Alexander Will

In the Name of God Amen, I Samuel Alexander of  
the County of Twiggs State considering the precariousness of life  
& the certainty of death & being now in perfect health & in the  
full enjoyment of my intellectual faculties do make this my  
last will & testament in manner & form following. Wiz:

In the first place I commend my soul into the hands of  
Almighty God who gave it & my body to the care of my surviving  
friends as to my worldly goods I dispose of them in manner following  
Item 1<sup>st</sup> I wish it distinctly understood that my wife ~~the~~ <sup>my</sup> husband  
Alexander is to hold in her own right all the property that we  
was willed her by her former husband (John Bush) that at  
my death she is not to receive any part of my estate except that  
willed her in the foregoing part of this Item

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I wish it also distinctly understood that I have already given  
I loaned unto my four children to wit late Mary Grimes  
now Mary Grimes Penatti Roberts James Wooten Alexander and  
Asa Washburn Alexander all the property which I desire they shall  
receive from my estate

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I loan unto my daughter Mary Grimes during her natural  
life a nego woman named Dances & her increase & at her death  
I desire that the said nego woman & her increase as aforesaid to be  
equally divided amongst my said daughter Mary's children by both  
her former & present husbands or in other words to be equally divided

amongst his legitimate children  
Item 5th I leave unto my son James Wooster Alexander during his natural life the following negroes to wit Coate, Fcca, their  
After this in case of his death the said property I desire to be equally divided amongst his legitimate children  
Item 6th It is my desire that at my death before paying all my just whatever property may then belong to my estate whether in land or Stock bonds Notes Open Accounts or Cash shall be summed together divided amongst my grand children in manner following to wit the property shall be divided into four equal parts Let it be known that one shall be equally divided amongst the legitimate children of my daughter Mary Gates Mary Summons now Mary Grimes that one lot to be equally divided amongst the legitimate children of my other daughter Martha Reeds & a third lot to be equally divided amongst the legitimate children of my son James Wooster Alexander & the fourth & last lot shall be equally divided amongst the legitimate children of son Isa Castellow Alexander  
Item 6th I hereby appoint my two sons to wit James Wooster Alexander and Isa Castellow Alexander also my two sons in law (to wit) Willis H. & William Grimes executors of this my last will & Testament  
In witness of the above I have hereunto set my hand & seal ninth day of December in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred nineteen
