Green County I In the name of God Amen.

I Samuel Lancaster of the County and State aforesaid being advanced in Years and much afflicted and knowing that death is the common lot of man, but being of sound mind and memory do make and constitute this my last will and testament viz.

Item 1st My Will and desire is that my last debts be first paid

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rebecca the following property, one bed, Bedstead Furniture, one Walnut Table, one Lock, Chair, one table, one small round one side Saddle, one corner cupboard, one Horse Collar, Drive three head of Cattle and their increase after my death to be at her own disposal at her death, my will is also that my wife Rebecca, remain on my land, or keep

the benefit of my son as a home for her and my Daughter
Merranda Lancaster during his natural life.

Item 3^d

I give and bequeath unto my son Moses B. Lancaster five dollars
to be paid him by my executors.

Item 4th

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Patsy E. Lancaster, one
Bed, Chested & two furniture, one large trunk, one large
Binnacle con Half

Item 5th

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Merranda B. Lancaster
all the land, I may die in possession of after the death of my
wife as named in the second item, together with all the
property or its proceeds not heretofore disposed of after my
just debts are paid out of the Am. m^o on a sale of
such articles as may be found belonging to me at my death.

Item 6th

I do hereby and in these presents appoint and constitute
Herndon Parsons and James M. Lewis my Executors
to carry this my last will and testament into execution
according to its tenor.
