 but in no other respect which I wish to be valued by judicious

 may receive an equal portion of my estate with the increase of
 any at the decease of my wife Martha or at the time of
 her intermarriage with any other person. Thirdly I request
 that this my last will & testament be recorded in the clerk's
 office without alteration immediately after my decease
