

In the name of God Amen I Stephen Bishop of the State of Georgia and County of Greene being of sound mind and memory but recollecting the certainty of death do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament

It is my will and desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner and as it respects such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bestow on me in this life I devise and dispose of the same in the following manner to wit

Item 1st It is my will and desire that all my just debts and funeral Expenses be paid

Item 2nd It is my will and desire and I do will and bequeath unto my daughter Lydia Noble one half of the Land and premises whereas I now live either or devised as it is hereafter described and in case of sale one half of the proceeds thereof to the said Lydia Noble in fee simple & her heirs etc

Item 3rd It is my will and desire and I do hereby give and bequeath to the orphan Children of James Bishop dec^d (viz) Wilson & Bishop, Patsy M Bishop, Wemyss & Bishop, Minnie M Bishop, and Mabel Bishop the other half of the Land and premises whereas now live to be equally divided among said orphan Children; but provided they die in declining the said them and in that case it is further my will and desire that they be sold at the discretion of my Executors and the proceeds divided equally as above stated in addition to other property heretofore given.

Item 4th It is my will and desire and I do hereby give and bequeath to my son Asa Bishop a tract or lot of Land drawn by Fanny Bishop in Wilkeson County drawn also further bequeath to Asa Bishop one negro Boy named Ben Tucker about years old, one desk one Clock & Case, one Bed, furniture and Books read and one set Blacksmiths Tools in fee simple in addition to other property heretofore given

Item 5th It is my will and desire and I do give and bequeath to my daughter Maria Newton the use of Two negroes Yingo & Smith his wife during her natural life and her death to be equally divided among her Children in addition to other property heretofore given

Item 6th It is my will and desire and I do give and bequeath to my Executors heretofore to be named one negro girl whose name and her increase to be applied to the use of my daughter Polly Bishop during her natural life (viz) her husband and her heirs & assigns in fee simple in addition to other property heretofore given

Item 7th It is my will and desire and I do hereby give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Hagerty the use of Two negro girls namely Phillis & Sucky during her life and then to be equally divided among Mary Hagerty's Children in addition to other property heretofore given

Item 8th It is my will and desire and I do hereby give and bequeath to my Executors heretofore to be named seven negroes (viz) Jim Punch and his wife Abby Jacke young Jim also Ann & Olga with their increase to be applied to and for the use of Fanny Bishop my daughter during her natural life, or until my said daughter Fanny Bishop marries, but in the event her marriage then and in that case it is my will and desire that Jim Punch and his wife Abby Ann and Olga be equally divided among all my Children or their legal representatives in the event of the marriage of my daughter Fanny Bishop then and in that case it is further my will and desire and I do bequest to my Executors hereafter to be named three negroes (viz) Jacke young Jim, and Abby a girl for the use of Fanny Bishop during her life and at her death to be equally divided among all my Children or their legal representatives. It is further my will and desire and I do give and bequeath to my

Furniture and bedstead three horses three cows and calves & three sows & pigs all her choice
constituted & took a sufficient for one year provisions for want of brooking ware
one chest one yoke of Oxen and farming tools with all the cash notes bonds
& bank accounts that I may be in possession of at my death in addition to what she
may have heretofore given her

Item 9th It is my will and desire and I do hereby give and bequeath to my Executors
hereinafter to be named three negroes viz. Sam or Wey and Will or Wey and Nancy &
that all these children of sibbys to be applied to and for the use of Jane Fielder during
her life and after her death to her ^{Legal} children if any in fee simple, but in case of no
child nor children legal heirs then it is further my will and desire the three negroes
(viz) Men Will and Nancy with increase to be equally divided among all my chil-
dren or their legal representatives also it is my will that Jane Fielder my grand
daughter have one bedstead & furniture and one small trunk and remains with my
daughter Fanny Bishop and under her care with her property until she (said Jane Fielder)
marries or arrives to the age of twenty two years. It is further my will and desire that the
most liberal construction be given not injure any part of the devise herein made to
this my will in all cases including increase and the legal representatives &c

Item 10th It is further my will and desire and I do hereby require that all my house
hold and kitchen furniture stocks of all kinds farming utensils waggons and gear with
all other property not otherwise disposed is to be sold at the discretion of my Executors
herein after to be named and equally divided among all my children or their legal representatives
I the said Stephen Bishop do hereby nominate constitute and appoint William Hagerty
and Bishop and William Noble my lawful Executors to execute this my last will and
Testament hereby nullifying and revoking all former wills and Testaments legacies and bequests
heretofore made ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament
given under my hand and Seal this February 15th day of 1821
