Thomas Fambroughs Will

I, Thomas Fambrough of the County of Genesee in the State of New York being of sound & disposing mind & memory do make & Ordain this to be my last will & Testament revoking all others in manner following to wit

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Anderson Fambrough five Dollars and all my wearing apparel above what I have heretofore given him

Then I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Bart a negro girl named Mary over and above what I have heretofore given her

Then I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Sally Bart a negro girl named Eliza

Then I give and bequeath to my beloved son Thomas Fambrough Genesee a negro woman named Hannah and her two children Nancy & Emanuel over and above what I have heretofore given him

Then I give and bequeath to my son William Fambrough one dollar in addition to what I have heretofore given him

Then I give and bequeath to my grand son Thomas Fambrough son of William a negro boy named David

Then I give and bequeath to the lawful heirs of my son William to be equally divided among them two negro men Joe & Jack

Then I give to my beloved and affectionate wife Mary Fambrough a negro man named Jesse and his wife Daphne and all the household furniture & stock & plantation as to be kept by her during her widow hood or until my two youngest daughters Abigail & Eliza or either of them marry or become of age but if she marry or either of ^{the} children marry then it is to be equally divided between the three except the two negroes above named which remain the property of the above named Mary. It is further more my will and desire that my ^{with} named wife Mary keep possession of the said interest I own live & the negro

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 Herein after bequeathed to my two youngest Children during her maidenhood but
 when she marry the land to be equally divided between her and the two Children
 and they have the negroes bequeathed to them
 Item I give and bequeath to my two daughters Abigail & Elena, Isaac, Edmund
 among their Children to be equally divided between them when either marry
 or become of age and it is my will and desire that they receive a decent English
 education and in case either should die without issue the success will be
 entitled to the negroes named in the bequest

Item It is my will and desire that of the property left to my two youngest
 Children should be out a residing Condition that it be taken into the management
 of my son Thomas & Anderson

Item I do hereby nominate & appoint my beloved wife Mary & my son Thomas
 & Anderson my Executors my Attorneys In testimony whereof I hereunto set
 my hand and affix my seal this 13th day of April 1827

Georgia (Green County). The last will and Testament of John Holt late of Green County decd who died on the tenth of September 1826
 witnessed & subscribed at his own residence in said County declared by him by word of mouth on the ninth day of September 1826 his last will
 to be "It is my wish that my wife Mary Holt should have all my property". Those were the words spoken by the said John
 Holt in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our names as Witnesses thereof this thirteenth day of September 1826 in full

Georgia (Green County) Court of Ordinary January Term 1827

The foregoing instrument or statement of the Municipal Will of John Holt late of said County &c. being
 now on file in open Court by Mary Holt widow of said decedent and a caveat against the probate thereof having
 been filed by Samuel L. Guin & others. The witnesses thereto were severally examined and it appearing that the execution of the last will being fully
 completed with. It is ordered and Considered by the Court that the contents of said instrument or statement be taken and regarded as the
 last will and Testament of said John Holt decd. & that the same be committed to record as such.

 Superior Court, at which time the Special Jury by their verdict confirmed the above will of John Holt. & Rule No. 21 on the
