## Thomas Greer's will

In the name of God amen. I Thomas Greer of the County of Greene & State of Georgia being weak in body but of sound mind & memory blessed be Almighty God for the same do publish this my last will & testament in manner & form as follows viz.

First. I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Leticia Greer the plantation whereon I now live with all the appertinances thereunto belonging with all the plantation tools household & kitchen furniture & stock of all kinds except that part of the horses that my son John W. Greer may have a share in likewise one gig & harness one or east one negro man named Edenborough one diller named Ben one ditto named Martin one negro woman named Sarah one ditto named Boney one negro girl named Lilly Stem. I also give to my eldest son Thomas Greer one half of two tracts of land containing in all three hundred thirty six acres adjoining the same in the fourth district with thereunto also one negro man named Thom one ditto named Peter one boy named Jesse one ditto named Andrew.

I give & bequeath to my youngest son John H. Greer the property viz the other half of the above mentioned two tracts of adjoining the Ocean likewise likewise the one half of a fifteen to twenty year acre tract in the County of Washington adjoining B. Blount & others also six negroes namely Henry Kitty Lizzy Kate Ran & Eden

Item To my granddaughter Elizabeth L. Greer I give & bequeath one girl named ~~Ann~~ Mary to my <sup>next</sup> eldest grand daughter Cordelia I give one negro girl named Phannar To my grand daughter Sophia Caroline Greer I give & bequeath one negro girl named Abby & my grand daughter Eugenia L. Greer one negro girl name Charlotte Lastly I appoint my beloved wife Letitia L. Greer executrix & my two sons Thomas & John executors of this my last will & testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 26th July child Julia daughter of Kitty not mentioned above I give to my son John Signed sealed & acknowledged

In the name of God amen I Joshua Bunkley of the County of Greene & State of Georgia being weak in body but of sound mind & memory knowing it is appointed unto me to die do ordain this my last will & testament first of all I give my soul to God who gave it my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion of my friends Teaching such worldly goods as it pleased God to to bless me with I bequeath in the following manner I will all my lawful debts first to be paid I all my property to be together on the plantation whereon I now live that my beloved wife Elizabeth Bunkley draw for herself individually one third of the net arising from my plantation & farm after all the families support & farm expenses is paid & this during her lifetime or widowhood but in the event of my wife's death or marriage my property is to be equally divided
