11th I give and bequeath to my wife Anna Strickwell should keep, Bob, Mary, & Nancy all the stock of every description & all the farming utensils on the plantation and the Negroes should work for the support of her and the children so long as they remain

13th I will & bequeath to my son James Strickwell A Negro to be worth One hundred dollars and a good horse & saddle, Also eight hundred dollars to be paid out of the Crop on my plantation each year

18th I leave my whole wife Anna Strickwell, or my son James Strickwell to Act on the will. All of which I willingly subscribe to and affix my hand & seal this 29th August in the presence of

In the name of God Amen

I Thomas Hubbard of the State of Georgia (and of late years recollecting that all men must die and finding myself declining have thought proper to make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following viz I give and bequeath to my wife Nancy Hubbard to take the care and charge of my Estate both and personal together with my Children during their Minority, her widowhood or life and the privilege to my Executor or Executors and wife that if any one of my Children should be of age or marry to give to them as negro or other property at a fair valuation of disinterested persons and such Child or Children shall receive the same as a part of the legacy of my Estate also for my Children while they remain with their mother to be supported and settled free from all charges and I further wish both the natural and required use and profits of my Estate to be considered as a part thereof and belonging therunto

2nd I give and bequeath to my two sons John and William Hubbard the tract of land out which I now here reside lying on the waters of the Apalachee in Greene Co to be equally divided and for the said land to be considered in the general division of my property as equivalent to twelve hundred Dollars received by each of them and for them to go into the possession of the same at the death or intestacy of my wife or at such other time as my Executor or Executors & wife can conveniently have the same from my Estate

3rd I give and bequeath to my son Thomas the tract of land lying in this County

(generally called the Mark Jackson tract) which will be considered in the general division by my Executors as equivalent to the sum of Twelve hundred received by him and for him to go into the possession of his under the circumstances and in the same way as those above mentioned

1st I give and bequeath to my son James Twelve hundred Dollars for the purpose of procuring him a tract of land equal in value to the other sons above mentioned and I wish my Executors to see him in procuring the above land, or rather for them to procure it for him against his becoming of age, and I wish my Executors and hereby authorize them to make sales of a fraction lying in Morgan County on the Apalaches at some prudent time for the purpose of assisting to raise the money above contemplated

2nd I give and bequeath to my four Daughters Elizabeth Nancy Martha & Sophia whenever they receive such negro or other property as can be (Share) from the plantation Commensally which they or any one of them will receive as a part of their legacy at the appraised value of disinterested persons

3rd I wish my Executor or Executors at the death or intermarriage of my wife to make sales of all my property not herein specially bequeathed and for them to make an equal division of the same among all my Children so that each one may receive an equal portion taking into view all bequests and all property given off at valuation heretofore

Lastly I do hereby appoint my wife Nancy Hubbard Lodwick Alford and Miss Fitzpatrick my Executors to execute this my last will and Testament

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this the eighth day of November in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two. Witnessed before assigned in several places
