or second part to this my last will and testament do
make the following (to wit) I give my Negro woman
Tilla to my executors herein before named in trust during
her life in manner and form following, the said Executors
shall not be compelled to account to the legatees named
in this will for more than twelve ^{twelve} ~~de lego~~ for the first year
after my death for the said Tilla and eleven for the
second year and so on one dollar less every year for
twelve years, the balance of the profits if any there should
be to go to the said Negro Tilla it is further
my will that my Negroes be so divided, that my Boy
Billy and his wife Penny shall not be separated —
It is further my will and I do here by order the same
that if any legatees named in the foregoing will shall
refuse or object to abide by this my will he she
on they shall forfeit all claim or interest in my Estate
and I do hereby forever bar the same any thing here
contained notwithstanding, I testamony whereof I
have here unto set my hand and seal this the
twenty third day of December 1830

The last will and testament of Thomas Riley late of
Greene County deceased, who died on the twenty fifth
day of November in the year Eighteen Hundred and
thirty at his own residence in said County, declared
by him by word of mouth on the twenty first
day of November in the year Eighteen hundred and
thirty "I wish my property to be equally divided

153 among all my children - and I wish my son in law
Seaborn McMichael to have Justice done him ;
& I wish Seaborn to see and do Justice to the rest
of my children. Now these the words spoken by
the said Thomas Riley in his last sickness in the
presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our
names as witnesses thereof, this third day of January
in the year eighteen hundred and thirty one

line and running in such a manner as to conclude the
House where he now lives & Spring & then up to the publick
road so as to conclude Twenty Five Acres

Item 3rd I will & bequeath to my wife Mary Kennedy The remainder
of my property during her natural life

Item 4th I will that after the death of my wife that my land
be equally divided between the heirs of Alice Hayes Mrs.
Kennedy, Jonathan Kennedy, Nancy Kennedy, Mary Kennedy
Item 5th I will and bequeath to my daughters Nancy & Mary
Kennedy, all my perishable Property over and above their
Share in the Land

Item 6th I will that my Sons Jonathan & Andrew Kennedy bear
this my last Will and Testament
