I Thomas Starkes bent being perfect mind and memory in the name of God I make
my last Will and Testament I give to Elizabeth Starkes on a settlement made between her
and myself all the real and personal property that the said Starkes got by her which was nine
negroes and six hundred and 12 acres of more or less on Taylors Creek which she agreed to take in
full satisfaction of my property in our parting settlement. More that I give after this settlement
One horse 2 Cows and Calves One hundred bushels of Corn Meal I give and bequeath to
Nelly Elam for the respect and love and good services to me that I have for her One negro
named Constant Josh Faw and one at my death for her to take in possession
as she thinks proper with let her take her horses worth one hundred and twenty Dollars
all my household furniture 4 Cows and Calves ten head of hogs this to be her property
as she pleases as long as she lives if she has any children to and the said Starkes
may divide it as she thinks proper Among them if she has none at her death the
she goes to my Children such of them as is alive to be divided among them share and
the rest of my property my debts is to be paid out of it then Equally divided Among my
children Jane Williams and Louisa Sharpe then able to be divided by James Starkes
I acknowledge this to be my last will and Testament signed in the presence of witness

In the name of God amen I George Stovall of the County of Rutherford being in sound mind and memory yet failing to mind the certainty of death and the uncertainty of life doth make this my last Will (and) testament revoking all other Wills or Testaments heretofore by me made (to wit) I give and bequeath to my wife Polly Stovall all my Estate both real (and) personal during her widowhood and after her death to be divided equally among my children (and) among my wife and children that the value thereof shall be ascertained by my Executors herein after mentioned (and) a true record kept thereof that when an equal distribution shall take place among all my children that such property given shall be a part of their Legacy also my Israel of (him) lying in Williamson County in the twentieth District thereof number two hundred and ninety five granted to father Walden (should) be sold on a credit of twelve months (and) the money arising therefrom for the benefit of my wife and children (and if my wife should marry after her widowhood it is then my will that she should take the third part of my Estate real (and) personal (and) the other two to be equally divided among all my children (and) after the death of my wife the other two to be divided in like manner this first I do hereby constitute (and) appoint John Miller John Willborn (and) my wife Polly Stovall and John Stovall my son Executors of this my last Will (and) testament In witness whereof I have set my hand (and) sealed affixed my seal this 2d day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen
