In the name of God amen I Thomas Wilson of the County
Greene State of Georgia being weak in body but of sound mind
I remember knowing that it is appointed unto man to die
I declare this my last will & testament First of all I give my soul
that who gave it Every body to the earth to be buried in a
decent Christian like manner at the direction of my
friends As touching such worldly goods as I have I bequeath
that to bless me with I bequeath in the following manner
viz I will that after my death that all my property but
what I cannot be sold & after all my just debts are paid
money arising from the sale of my property shall be used
in the purchase of Bonds Stock or put out upon Interest at
direction of my executor I that my wife Elizabeth Wilson
draw annually from the executor the sum of two hundred
forty dollars during her life & that after her death the part
of my estate go to the heirs of William Lupton I will
as if said William were my lawful executor to this my
will I testament whereunto I set my hand & fixed my seal
this 2nd day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred twenty five
