 the sum of one Dollar to be raised ~~out~~ out of my Estate
 Thirdly I give (and bequeath to my son John Wootles the sum of one dollar to be raised out of my Estate
 Fourthly I give (and bequeath to my son Jesse Wootles the sum of one dollar to be raised out of my Estate
 Fifthly I give (and bequeath to my son Willard Wootles the sum of one dollar to be raised out of my Estate
 Sixthly I give (and bequeath to my son Allen Wootles the sum of one Dollar to be raised out of my Estate
 Seventhly I give (and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Wootles One feather Bed Wootshead & furniture
 also One Cow (and Calf to her (and her heirs forever
 Eighthly I give (and bequeath to my son Buren Wootles the tract of Land whereon I now
 live to be delivered to him at my death to him (and his heirs forever. I also
 give (and bequeath to my S. son Buren Wootles One sorrell horse one sow and pig
 (and one feather bed (and furniture
 Ninthly It is my will (and desire that if any thing remains of the balance of my
 Estate after paying my just debts that the same be (and remain in the hands of my
 wife Sarah Wootles during her lifetime (and for her to dispose of the same at her
 death as she thinks proper
 Tenthly (and lastly I constitute (and appoint my beloved Wife Sarah Wootles and my
 son Buren Wootles Executors (and Executor of this my last Will (and Testament
 and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke (and disannul all and every other former
 testaments Wills legacies bequests (and Executors by me in any wise before named
 written (and bequeathed ratifying (and confirming this (and no other to be my
 last Will (and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 (and seal this twentyfifth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand
 seven hundred and seventeen
