

## (William) Tiggs's Will)

Georgia) In the name of God, Amen I William Tiggs of the County State aforesaid being in  
Greene County, a low state of health but a sound and disposing mind and Conscous both of the Certainty  
(and the Uncertainty of death have thought proper to make and do hereby make and ordain as follows This  
to be my last Will and Testament.

I command my body to the dust to be decently buried (and any soul is free who gave it)

I direct (and require that my executors herein after named do pay immediately to Collect all debts due me and  
debt as are not due as soon as they become payable except a note of John Coleman one which indulgence is  
to be given to any reasonable extent provided it is well secured

I Will (and direct that the expenses of my last illness my funeral expenses and all my just debts  
be paid as soon as sufficient to discharge the same shall be Collected

I give (and bequeath to my friend John Coleman my field patent leather watch my horse Bayle Hoddie

I give (and bequeath to Thomas E. Foster (my Executor herein after appointed) Five thousand five hundred Dollars  
one trust (and for the sole (and supreme) use (and benefit of Mrs Ann Coleman whose kindness and attention to  
me thru a long lingering illness I can in no other way return or acknowledge. And my will and desire is that my  
said Executor as Trustee for Mrs Coleman do lay out at least two thousand five hundred Dollars of said sum at  
legal interest, the interest to be paid Annually in Advance; which said amount of interest is to belong to Mrs Coleman  
on application where receipt alone shall be sufficient another for the payment. At the death of Mrs Coleman my  
will (and desire is that the (and sum of Five thousand five hundred Dollars be equally divided among such children  
as she may have living at the time of her death; and that the same be paid to such Guardians as may be appointed  
for said children. Should my (and Executor, Foster as hereinafter appointed depart this life before the trust hereby  
created is fully performed I rely on a Court of Equity to appoint an other Trustee to carry into effect the object herein expressed  
under the Specified limitations and restrictions

After the payment of debts (and expenses (and the legacies herein before Specified should there be a sufficient sum for that  
purpose I give (and bequeath to William H. Hall infant son of Alexander Hall three hundred Dollars to be paid to  
be paid to said Alexander Hall as natural Guardian for his (and son)

After the payment of the legacy last aforesaid I give (and bequeath to the Rev. Lovick Pearce the sum of Fifty  
Dollars to be applied towards the payment of the debt incurred by the building the Methodist Church in Somers.

All my debts (and the legacies mentioned together with the necessary expenses attending the execution of this my last  
Will and Testament being discharged I give the residue of my Estate to my friend John Coleman as an acknowledgement  
of that hospitality and friendly attention which he has liberally bestowed upon me

I nominate Constitute (and Appoint Thomas E. Foster Executor of this my last Will (and Testaments) and I authorize  
none of in his opinion it should become necessary to apply any part of the principal fund Confided to him in trust for Mrs  
Coleman to or for her use or benefit to make such application provided it should not exceed the sum of five hundred  
Dollars and provided an order be obtained from the Court of Ordinary for that purpose

I do hereby make (and declare null (and void all other Wills Testaments bequests or devise by me hitherto  
made (and make (and ordain this to be my only last Will (and Testament.

(State of Georgia, I Bermelia Bookles of the County State & County aforesaid being very sick and weak in body  
(poore Country (but of perfect mind & memory) calling unto mind the mortality of the body (and) knowing that it is  
appenned for all men once to die do make (and) Ordain this my last will & testament as follows  
Item 1<sup>st</sup> That all my just debts be paid

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give (and) bequeath to my beloved (and) only daughter Mary Ann Bookles one bed, 14 adt furniture &  
all other my (and) clothing which is not in common use, one Maple Chest, one pine side board one looking glass  
one half Dozen Earthen plates one Cotton arched & Cards two Pounds (and) three yearlings one note of hand on John F. Bookles  
of forty Dollars (and) one account of new Dollars one note of hand on Thomas Bookles of twenty Dollars balance due  
one note of hand on William D. Lankey (and) all my distributive share in the dower of my Mother Elizabeth Bookles  
at her death

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I do hereby Constitute (and) Appoint my friend Willis Borrest my Executor to this my last will & testament  
and I do hereby ample (and) fully empower him to take charge (and) dispose of the property before mentioned in this  
testament and whatever may be may think proper or best for the interest of my daughter Mary Ann Bookles.
