Georgia
I William Fretwells of the County of Green and State of
Georgia bring in sound mind and memory but weak in
Body and Knowing that it is appointed by God for all men to die do make
this my last will in the following manner 1st It is my desire that all my
just debts should be paid 2nd I will and bequeath to my wife Anna Fretwells
two Negroes viz Sarah a Woman & Green a Man and the plantation whereon
I now live, to have and to hold during her natural life
3rd It is my desire, that at the death of my beloved Wife the plantation and the Negroes
above named be sold and equal distribution made to my children Namely James
Fretwells, Nancy Fretwells, William Fretwells Jun^r, John Fretwells, Julia Fretwells,
Polly Fretwells, Betsey Fretwells, Amanda Fretwells, and Daniel Fretwells
4th I will and bequeath to my son Gullen Fretwells A Negro Man Ben, and
Peggy and her two children Nathan and Matilda
5th I will and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Fretwells A Negro Woman Rachel
and her youngest child Marcus whenever said Nancy Fretwells should Marry and pro-
vided the Negro woman should have an increase of child or children previous to the
Marriage of Nancy Fretwells, said increase to go to the benefit of the family
6th I will and bequeath to my Son William Fretwells Two Negro Boys Washington &
Simon
7th I will and bequeath to my Son John Fretwells Two Negro Boys Henry &
Neph
8th I will and bequeath to my Daughter Julia Fretwells Two Negro Girls Charity
& Emily
9th I will and bequeath to my Daughter Polly Fretwells Two Negro Girls Lucy
& Sarah
10th As there is not Negroes sufficient to make up to the balance of my
children two little Negroes each It is my wish that should there be an increase
of Negroes sufficient that Betsey Fretwells, Amanda Fretwells, & Daniel Fretwells
should have so many each as to make their portion of property equal with the
others that is two Negroes each but should there be a deficiency in said increase
it must be made up out of the Sale of any property not otherwise disposed of
Namely Robt, Mary, and Nancy and their increase at the time of the child

Marrying off or becoming of age

11th Feb^y my wife, that my wife, Anna, Strickwell should keep, Bob, Mary, & Nancy all the stock of every description & all the farming utensils on the plantation and that Negroes should work for the support of her and the children so long as they remain. 13th I will & bequeath to my Son James Strickwell a Horse to be worth one hundred dollars and a good Bridle & Saddle, Also eight hundred dollars to be paid out of the Crop made my plantation next year

15th I leave my beloved wife Anna Strickwell, & my Son James Strickwell to Act on the will of all of which I willingly subscribe to and affix my hand & seal this 22nd day of Nov^r in the presence of

I Thomas Hubbard of the State of Georgia (and of Greene Recollecting that all men must die (and finding myself declining) have thought proper to make (and publish this my last will (and Testament in manner (and form following 1st I wish my wife Nancy Hubbards to take the Care (and Charge of my Estate (and personal together with my Children during their Minority; her Widowhood or life per the privilege to my Executor or Executors (and wife that if any one of my Children should be of age or marry to give to them as wages or other property at a fair valuation of said persons (and such Child or Children shall receive the same as a part of the Legacy of my Estate also for my Children while they remain with their Mother to be supported and schooled free from all Charges (and I further wish both the natural (and Acquired income (and profits of my Estate to be considered as a part thereof (and belonging therunto 2nd I give and bequeath to my two sons John (and William Hubbard the Tract of Land out which I now have reside lying on the waters of the Apalachian in Greene County to be equally divided (and for the said Land to be considered in the general division of my property as Equivalent to twelve hundred Dollars received by each of them (and for them to go into the possession of the same at the death or minority of my wife or at such other time as my Executor or Executors & wife can conveniently share the same from my Estate

3rd I give (and bequeath to my Son Thomas the Tract of Land lying in this County
