

I William Greene of the County of Harris and State of Georgia being sick and of low condition but of sound mind and memory (and calling to mind that it is ordained for all men once to die do make this my last will and testament revoking all others

First of all I give my soul to God who is its creator, my Body I resign to its mother clay in decent Christian Burial

Item 1st I give to my dear wife Ruthy one negro woman named Selvy (and her heirs forever) Also I give to my dear wife Ruthy during her natural life the increase of the above negro woman Selvy together with (old Tom, Nestor, Shes, Hair Young Callis, Peter, Ephraim, Major and Tole Callis also all my Stock of Horses hogs Cattle (and sheep, together with the whole of my crop of Corn, Padded wheat oats & Cotton with my plantation Tools, one waggon (and) Biers together with all my household and kitchen furniture to have free (and) full possession of my house (and) plantation whereon I now live during her natural life

2nd I give to my son Samuel Greene one negro man named Jerry, one negro man named Sykes one negro man named Wallis one negro man named Jim together with his blacksmiths tools

3rd I give to my son Augustine Greene one negro man named Ransom one negro boy named Lony, one negro man named Jacob together with his blacksmiths tools together with the Tract of land whereon he now lives together with one equal half of my mill Tract of land

4th I give to my son Alston one negro man named Isham one negro boy named Page one negro boy named Wiley

5th I give to my son Philip one negro woman named Amy (and) her four children, one negro man named Tom one negro man named Jourdan and a set of blacksmiths Tools, my riding horse (and) gun also the Tract of land whereon I now live together with one equal half of my mill Tract of land

6th I give to my daughter Hannah Sally one negro woman named Hannah with two children John (and) Benben one negro woman named Pat, one negro boy named Mica (and) negro boy named Prince

7th I give to my daughter Nancy one negro woman named Keely (and) two children Phanny (and) Jack one negro woman named Synthia, one negro man named Sam (and) one negro girl named Lilly

8th I give to my daughter Pety one negro woman named Charly (and) one child named Tilly, one negro boy named Jacob, one negro girl named Hester one negro boy named Louis one negro boy named Randle

9th It is my will that after my just debts being first paid that my daughters receive out of my total Eighteen hundred and thirty six Dollars (and) the residue thereof to be equally divided among my Children my son Alston excepted

10th My will further is that my Stock of Goods (and) store debts be equally divided between my wife Ruthy and my Children

11th I appoint my wife Ruthy my son Sam, my son Augustine & Philip & my friend Douglas Watson Executors to this my last will (and) Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 8th December 1849

2^d It is my will that all my Estate remain in the hands of my wife for the purpose of supporting and educating my Children

3rd When my Children shall come of lawful age or marry to draw there from my Estate calculating at the seventh part real and personal to be done by them or Chosen by my Executors for that purpose

4th It is my will the part of my Estate remaining in the hands of my wife after my death be equally divided between all my Children

5th I give my son Silsman Baley one Horse worth Eight Dollars which is to be calculated in with his part of the 3^d Estate

6th I Appoint Robert Haynes and my son Silsman Baley my Executors Signed sealed & delivered in the presence of us
